Bo it - of his own violation.

Tonkinese Gulf.

the timing of the President's announcement of the air strikes along the coast of North Viet Nam. Secretary McNamara, telling newsmen - that our planes were sighted by enemy radar, And that Mr. Johnson - made the announcement immediately to forestall a statement by the Reds in Hanoi.

North and South Viet Nam, are both going to present statements - ok to the U N; written statements about - the Vietnamese crisis. The decided by the Security Council - ad after the Soviet delegate demanded that Na Hanoi be heard. And Adlai Stevenson agreed - as long as Bt Saigon got an invitation as well. The Security Council - saying - ohay, let's listen to North Viet Nam.

The symbol of the crisis in South Viet Nam - is the American "Delta Dagger". The F-One-Oh-Two - jet fighter. The long, slim delta daggers are now poised at all three jet air bases in South Viet Nam. They'll be the first into action - should the crisis erupt into a shooting war. Behind them - the big B-fifty seven bombers.

The build up is not proceeding at its former pace - for two reasons. First, because of the speed - with which we got our planes across the Pacific. Second, because the crisis is showing signs - of simmering down.

At least, the crisis between - the United States and North Viet Nam, In South Viet Nam, example a state of emergency. The Vietnamese braced to meet - stronger att acks by the Red guerrillas. And Premier Khanh is calling or the people north of the border - to overthrow their Communist masters.

The new assignment of Henry Cabot Lodge - is connected with his old one. Who could explain our southeast policy better than former Ambassador to South Viet Nam?

That was President Johnson's thinking - when he invited Cabot Lodge to a conference at hk the White House, And asked him to make a tour - of friendly capitals.—
