DORA

Hurricane Dora continues on her wild rampage. Battering the Northeast Florida coast, with
huge waves pouring over the beach at St. Augustine and
Jacksonville, flooding wide stretches of that long
coastline. Dora -- moving on a northwesterly course
with Georgia and South Carolina about to get hit. At
Savannah road and homes already flooded. Residents -moving inland.

Walter Reuther calls the new contract in the auto industry - "the most historic agreement in the history of the American Labor movement." It goes something like this: Retirement benefits - of as much as four hundred dollars a month, exclusive of Social Security. Early retirement - as early as age fiftyfive or sixty. A fifty percent increase in relief time - for workers on the assembly line. Also a basic wage increase of fourteen to twenty-four cents an hour - for the three years of the contract. Plus - more paid holidays and another week's vacation for all workers.

No wonder Mr. Reuther was beaming - as he emerged from that conference with the Chrysler Gerporation.

GOVERNOR JOHNSON

Not since Reconstruction days, says Democratic Governor Paul Johnson of Mississippi - has that state cast its electoral vote for a Republican Presidential Nominee.

But this year, predicted the Governor at the Mississippi State Democratic Convention - the conservative candidate will carry Mississippi with a "tremendous majority". Barry Goldwater - not mentioned by name. But there's no doubt - who has Governor Johnson's support. However Governor Johnson urged the State delegates to put up - only one slate of democratic Presidential electors. And to pledge it to - President Johnson. Not create two slates - one for Johnson, one for Goldwater. He wants the voters to have a clear-cut choice in November, - between the conserve Johnson-Humphrey ticket.

PRIMARIES

The most interesting result of the crop of primaries # is that nomination of Richard Kleindienst - as Republican candidate for governor of Arisona.

Kleindienst - was field director of the "Draft Goldwater" Committee before the G.O.P. Convention.

Now he seems to have applied his strategy to his own campaign - with equally successful results. A key Goldwater man - in the running for Governor of Arizona.

LA FOLETTE

The statement that Wisconsin has a candidate named La Folette - seems almost like a truism. Haven't there always been La Folettes - in the politics of the Badger State?

Well, not quite - "always." But they've been prominent ever since the roady days - of Fighting Bob La Folette. The spellbinder who served his state as - Congressman, Senator and Governor, Then ran for President on the Progressive ticket - in nineteen twenty-four. The year -- that Coolidge won.

Fighting Bob's son was in the Senate for three terms - before being defeated by Joe McCarthy in nineteen forty. Now - it's the grandson. Bronson La Falotte, Democratic nominee - for state Attorney General.

Still together - Wisconsin and the La Folettes.

U.S. Ambassador Maxwell Taylor was not displaying any pessimism about South Viet Nam as he talked with newsmen today - after reporting to President Johnson in the White House.

He sees no visible sign of a military setback because of the political crisis. And believes - the
anti-Communists are getting stronger. The presence of
these extra American military advisors - helping
things along. The Vietnamese MM economy good. If it
weren't for the Communist rebels MM the country would
be prosperous - says Ambassador Taylor.

ANTI-AIRCRAFT

Another move reported tonight - in the struggle between Indonesia and Malaysia. Malaysia, says Sukarno of Indonesia, is a tool of British imperialism." Which he -- is determined to crush.

This time he has landed -- about a hundred guerillas and forty paratroopers in Malaysia.

To counteract which units of the British

The Communist-dominated Air Transport

Workers' Union in Jakarta - refusing to allow Pan Am

passengers including five Japanese members of

Parliament, to disembark at the airport. Refusing to

service the plane - on the ground. Their objection -
that the U.S.A. is supporting Malaysia not Indonesia
they say. So -- Pan Am had to fly its passengers back

to Singapore.

COMMUNISM

The phrase "Third Force" - is becoming popular again. But now it doesn't mean - the second class powers caught between the two giants. Britain and France, for example - between the United States and the Soviet Union.

The reference this time - is to the Communist

bloc. The smaller Red nations are talking about

forming a "Third Force" - between Russia and Red China.

The idea, said to be especially popular - in Eastern

Burope. The Satellites, noving away from the idea
that they must choose between Moscow and Peking.

Preferring to band together was go it alone.

The Red Empire is already split - into two parts.

Now, another division - seems imminent. A Communist

- "Third Force."
