With twenty-seven boats competing in six races, today's Spring Fever Regatta is the largest modern day crew event ever to be held on the Connecticut River. Moreover, the Regatta is the first encounter for Wesleyan Crew this season. Entering three eight- and two four-man shells, Wesleyan will have more boats rowing competitively than at any time in its eight-year modern history.

Four oarsmen with previous varsity experience—Club President George Surgeon, Douglas Thompson, Brian Mahoney, and Michael Robinson—will be rowing today, as well as four former JV oarsmen, including team Captain R. Robertson Hilton, and five members from the 1971 "Cinderella" freshman eight. Evidence of the popularity of Wesleyan Crew is given by the fact that twenty members of the Class of 1975—sixteen oarsmen and four coxswains—will be competing today.

Members of the various boats have completed a rigorous and extensive training program under the direction of coaches Phil Calhoun, Rob Calhoun, and Dave Snyder. Sixteen oarsmen participated in popcorn sales last fall to pay expenses for two weeks of double-session practices in Miami during the intersemester period. Since the beginning of the spring semester, the oarsmen have been lifting weights and running at Fayerweather Gymnasium. Because of the generous support of alumni and friends this year, the Club was enabled to hold double-session workouts during the last two weeks.

After today's regatta, Wesleyan Crew will travel to New London to meet Coast Guard, Ithaca, and LaSalle next Saturday. On April 22, Wesleyan will host the University of Rhode Island and Holy Cross at the Harbarow Regatta. The fourth annual Little Three Regatta will take place April 29, with Amherst and Williams coming to Middletown. The Rusty Callow and Dad Vail Regattas follow on the two subsequent weekends.
