The fighting in East Pakistan - a dramatic turn today. New Delhi announcing that Indian forces have now seized a key rail line - linking northwestern Dinajpur District with the rest of East Pakistan. According to observers - this setting the stage for a possible full-scale assault in the Dinajpur area; which if successful - we are told - could enable India to set up there - a home base for the rebel state of Bangla Desh.

Meanwhile, Pakistan Federal troops stationed at Dacia on the Bramaputra were undertaking today a so-called
"clearing of zones of fire and lines of communication" around that city. In the process they were wiping out whole villages - and killing an estimated two hundred and fifty Bengalis. Such is one report.
