*Along the way, George McGovern cast his ballot today - at his home town of Mitchell, South Dakota. - said that polls notwithstanding - he was still optimistic about the outcome. "I have a very good feeling about it" - said he. And then - a brief visit to his alma mater, Dakota Wesleyan.*

## **SAN CLEMENTE**

**President Nixon cast his ballot - at San Clemente; shortly after voting - the President and Mrs. Nixon flew back to Washington; there to await the outcome - and later to attend what they hope will be a victory celebration.**

**BONN**

**At Bonn - agreement today on a treaty - in essence, ending at last the cold war between East and West Germany. The new pact calling for "full cooperation - on the basis of equal rights." In the words of West Germany's Willy Brandt - "breaking the ice that has frozen relations between" the two Germanys "for many years."**

**MIAMI**

*After two days as a jet-borne "man without a country" - two days of bouncing from nation to nation - Meyer Lansky has finally found a new home. The reputed underworld czar - arrived today at Miami Airport, the end of the line; and there he was promptly seized - by FBI agents.*

*Meyer Lansky now free on bail of Six-Hundred-Fifty ~~thousand~~ thousand dollars charges such as - income tax evasion, interstate transport in aid of racketeering, and failure to answer a grand jury subpoena:*

*You name it - the Greeks had a word for it. Take, for example Thesaurus - from the Greek "Thesaurus" meaning treasure. And now comes a report that the University of California at Irvine, California is currently compiling the world's first Thesaurus in ancient Greek.*

*This - we are told - an effort "to fill a void that has existed - virtually since the renaissance," a void "in fields such as - philology - linguistics - history, philosophy - literature.*

*It won't be easy though. Doctor Theodore Brunner, who heads the project, predicting it will take years and years - even using computers. The language of the ancient Greeks containing an estimated million words used in different contexts and time frames. By comparison, the total body of ancient Latin - less than <sup>one</sup> tenth that of the Greeks. And Latin scholars have been trying to compile a Latin Thesaurus - for nearly a hundred years - we are told. At last report - up to the letter "M". "M" as in - "capital Mmmm."*

## GEORGETOWN

*A study aimed at pinpointing delinquent - prone children - is the subject of a new book by the Reverend Father Juan Cortes of Georgetown University. It's called - "Delinquency in Crime: A Biophysical Approach"; coming to the conclusion that most delinquents - come from broken or tormented homes; but more than that - they are also generally mesomorphs, meaning persons of muscular build.*

*Why should this be true? Because - says Father Cortes - muscularity generally runs hand-in-hand - with "vital energy, love of risk, physical courage and enthusiastic dynamism;" which - if frustrated early in life - can only lead to trouble. And more's the pity - says Father Cortes - for "the very persons who are persistent in crime - could be just as persistent and successful in most anything else they might undertake."*
