cease-fire today - in the Middle East, Both sides setting aside the tools of war - in preparation for another major confrontation. This time - to see who will win the peace.

Despite Egypt's disastrous defeat - Nasser also id said to demand withdrawal of Israeli forces to Nineteen

Forty-Nine truce lines. Conceding only that he might accept

a United Nations presence - at Sharm El Sheikh at the entrance to the Gulf of Akaba.

Israeli response - quick and straight to the point.

From Jerusalem, Premier Levi Eshkol telling the nations of the world - that Israel cannot and will not return to conditions that existed prior to the war. Adding, therefore, that Israel itself - must be allowed to work out a peace settlement directly with the Arabs; rather than sign a UN armistice agreement - such as those that have kept Israel in a technical state of war for nineteen years.

Eshkol further charging that the UN - by its

"inactivity" in the face of an Arab threat - had actually

encouraged Nasser to proceed with aggression against

Israel. The choice now - said he - is between regional

peace, true cooperation, and activities for the benefit of

all the nations in the Middle East: or else -- a continuation

of hatred and hostility.

WASHINGTON

Here at home - President Johnson getting into the act - but just barely; with a speech today - to an AFL - CIO building trades convention.

"Today in the Middle East - as in Vietnam and in America - said the President -- "we are faced with the task of rebuilding; of putting together a human equation - where Man can live together in peace and harmony.

"Where Man can live" - the President went on "as the Prophet Micah said -- every man under his vine
and fig tree - and none shall make them afraid."

Apart from that - little comment on the lightning war. And none at all on the major question - of Israel's intention to keep some or all of the Arch territory on last week. Indeed, White House and State Department spokesmen later many saying - the matter was too "delicate" to discuss.

Algerian President Houari Boumedienne - a visitor today in Moscow. Arriving by plane for a series of talks with Kremlin leaders - beginning with Soviet Premier Kosygin.

President Boumedienne - first Arab leader to visit Russia -- in the wake of the mideast state of the Sources close to the Algerian saying he will try to find out -- "what went wrong with support expected from the Soviets." Also, whether the Soviets will now start to rebuild -- the lost Arab arsenal.

These same sources further quoted as saying:

"The fight against imperialism and Zionism is going to

be long - and we must count our enemies and our friends."

CAIRO FOLLOW MOSCOW

Speaking of friends and enemies - a public reconciliation today between two feuding Arab countries.

Radio Cairo announcing that Egypt and Tunisia - have decided to restore mutual diplomatic relations. The make=up following telephone conversations - between Egypt's Colonel Nasser and Tunisian President Habib Bourguiba.

The two countries at odds for more than a year you may recall; because of Bourguiba's regresuggestion - that
the Arab world should negotiate with Israel - on the question
of Palestine refugees. Even so - Tunisia providing both
troops and supplies to the Arab side - during last week's
fighting.

VIETNAM

War in Vietnam - interrupted briefly today by an act of mercy. The allies sending back to North Vietnam forty "sick or wounded" prisoners of war. Sending them back -- by way of that famous "freedom bridge."

At the same time - the Allies hinting that Hanoi might do something in return. Like send back some of an estimated two hundred American pilots - downed and captured during air attacks on the North. As yet, however, wething from Hanoi - we silence.

Russia's newest space vehicle - is soaring through the Heavens tonight. An unmanned space station weighing more than a ton - just getting started on a four-month flight to Venus.

Venus-Four attempting to duplicate the feat - of Russia's earlier successful Venus probes: Venus-Two -- that passed within fifteen thousand miles of the planet a year ago last February; and Venus Three - that crash-landed on Venus a year ago last March.

With luck - the Russians row hoping to get first pictures -- of the surface of that mysterious, cloud-covered planet. Venus-three having failed in that assignment -- when its cameras quit working the minute it entered the Venusian atmosphere.

Incidentally, US space scientists planning to launch a similar probe - in just two days. Setting the stage - for another here-race in space.

From Red China - news today of the arrest of an Indian diplomat, Charged with being a spy - for both the United States and Russia.

The accused identified as K. Raghunath - second Secretary of the Indian Embassy in Peking. Official Red Chinese Radio 4 saying he allegedly photographed certain military installations last week. Adding that he would not be allowed to leave Red China - until he has been "dealt with according to Chinese law."

What of Raghunath's supposed diplomatic immunity?

We don't recognize it - said Peking.

SUPREME COURT

Today at the U S Supreme Court - final decision day for the spring term. Bringing forth - a last flurry of major rulings. Among them:

A unanimous decision declaring unconstitutional

-- various state laws banning mixed racial marriage;

five to four verdict upholding contempt of court

convictions - against Dr. Martin Luther King and other

Civil Rights leaders for refusal to obey a court

injunction -- against a demonstration in Birmingham in

Nineteen Sixty-Three.

Also, a six to three ruling declaring unconstitutional

-- a New York law permitting court-approved bugging in

criminal cases. And another verdict nullifying a half
million libel award - to former Major General Edwin Walker.

In the last case, however, the court reaffirming a four hundred and sixty thousand-dollar award - to former University of Georgia Athletic Director Wally Butts, This - against the Saturday Evening Post.

A final story From Cincinnati, Especially appropriate to the commencement season - now upon us.

Dr. Martin Luther King - whom I mentioned earlier - addressing an Inter-Faith meeting on the importance of learning. Citing education - rather than violence -- as the fastest route to "first-class citizenship."

Dr. King concluding then that the slogan of the American negro should not be -- "burn, baby, burn."

But rather -- "learn, baby, learn."

The current Middle East mix-up/exactly conducive to good humor. And yet - a light touch today at the United Nations. With Saudi Arabian Ambassador Jamil Baroody - taking a verbal jab at Egyptian Ambassador Mohammed Awad El Kony.

Baroody beginning in typical Arab vein - typical the last few days, anyway. Attacking the Kennedys - the Rockefellers - U S treatment of Indians - and U S civilization, in general. Finally, turning to El Kony who has argued loud and long the Egyptian cause at the United Nations.

Baroody declaring flatly -- "that Arabs do not know how to use deceit or duplicity." The reason - said he - looking straight at El Kony -- "because they talk too much."
