The final passage of the civil rights bill. The House of Representatives - voting its okay today; By a lopsided majority. The bill had already been passed by the Senate. So now it goes to the President - who will sign it. The new law, primarily, provides new voting guarantees for negroes in the South. Court appointed referees - to pass on the qualifications of negroes; If these are denied voting privileges - by local authorities.

But Lee Ki-Poong kie did have opposition. His opponent - the previous Vice President, John M. Chang; Who had won the office previously - by a large majority. Nevertheless, on March sizteenth John M. Chang was snowed under by Lee Ki-Poong. Which led to a storm of charges of rigging, terrorism, fraud.
