YOKOTA

Still some question tonight - as to who was right - who was wrong: in the case of that Vietnam-bound US airliner - downed by the Russians in the Kurile Islands.

While speculators were speculating - that the French President will rush through a series of sweeping reforms; and, then retire -- perhaps as early as this fall.

Moscow - the big three western powers delivered identical protests today to the Kremlin. Challenging the Soviet Union - for permitting East Germany to impose travel restrictions on West Berlin. This - said to be a violation of the four-power agreements of Nineteen Forty-nine. However, diplomatic sources ps predicting the Russians will simply reject the protests -- one, two, three.

HAMBURG
