GOOD EVENING EVERYBODY:

Dr. Harold Taylor, well-known educator, former college President, and Professor of Philosophy and History -- launched a World University today. If it was really the beginning of an institution that endures, then, of course, it was an historic moment.

The temporary headquarters of this World University is the estate of a multi-millionaire, on the outskirts of Brookville, on Long Island's busy Northern Boulevard. The names of a few of the young people enrolled in the first group will suggest how international it is:-

Nobuo Miyamoto of Matsuyama, Japan; Nina Sethi, wearing a lovely cool sari, by the way -- from New Delhi; Mohammed Shuhud Sa'aid, of Penang, Maylaya; Cesar Perez Saavedra, Mexico; Alain Depussé, France; Liviu Bota, Roumania;

Miss Po Chung Mar, Hong Kong; and, Mike Neff, Cedar Rapids, Iowa. And others from other lands.

The faculty includes Arthur Lall, diplomat, novelist and crack tennis player, from India; Professor Takeshi Ishida, from the University of Tokyo; Professor Othieno from Kenya; Sir Robert Watson-Watt, from Scotland; and Professor Chakravarty, Indian philosopher and former associate of Rabindrinath Tagore and Mahatma Gandhi.

In his opening remarks to students and faculty, the brilliant young Dr. Harold Taylor, took as his theme THE WORLD AS IT PRESENTLY EXISTS.

He pointed out how our modern world has expanded human consciousness far, far beyond the range of anything Man has ever known in the past. For until quite recently, much of our world was largely unknown. But now, as he put it, "the whole world is like a large city -- with slum areas here and there."

Tomorrow the small student body, from so many countries, will hear an address by Sir Robert Watson-Watt on "The Impact of Science on Contemporary Society". Sir Robert was the discoverer of Radar, and is an authority on the Ionosphere.

The purpose of this Institution launched today is to study the world as a whole - - in the larger sense. Dr. Taylor says there will be no attempt to justify any one political system. They will simply discuss the problems of human needs, physical, spiritual, and psychological. The broad aim of This World University, to help make our world habitable. As he put it: "The ultimate evil is to destroy life. The ultimate good is to enhance life".

"The function of education", he explained, "is to meet human needs; to have a concern for the welfare of others; so to live that you can enrich the life of another person".

KENNEDY

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CIVIL RIGHTS

Attorney General Robert Kennedy - was most urgent today. Pleading with Congress to accept the proposed ban on discrimination - in the Administration's Civil Rights bill. Asking the lawmakers to remove what he called "a daily insult to negroes". And prophesying that if the law isn't passed - more racial troubles will certainly erupt.

The Attorney General said he would be willing to go along with the Republican plan - for a fair employment proviso, if that would win Republican votes - for the ban. But he is opposed to changes that would weaken its purpose.
