Germans "owe a dept of gratitude to the U.S. - for ~~the help~~

~~will~~ <sup>to</sup> never be forgotten," said he.

LONDON

ANKARA

At Ankara <sup>after</sup> a seven-hour meeting of the Turkish National Security Council, ~~followed today by~~ a charge<sup>d</sup> that the U.S. arms embargo against Turkey - is a "unilateral violation of bilateral agreements." The Council also saying it "has defined the measures to be taken by Turkey" ~~and~~ ~~has informed the British government.~~ All of which is a first step - we are told - toward the possible closing of twenty-five U.S. bases in Turkey.

TOKYO

Prime Minister Miki of Japan - the victim of a strongarm attack today by a Japanese right-wing extremist.
