This afternoon, President Eisenhower invoked the Taft Hartley law - to end the steel strike. These being the steps, preliminary to getting an injunction, Which would send the steel workers back on the job - for an eighty day period. During which - negotiations for a settlement would be resumed.

This morning, it was back to work - for the striking longshoremen. The union - obeying a court order under the Taft-Hartley Law; Calling the strike off - for the legal eighty days; While negotiations for a settlement - are now resumed. The tie-up of Atlantic and Gulf ports - ended. For the time being at least.

at the White House, today. frying to decide on what to do about the eighty-seven pay old/steel strike. There's no sign - whether or pot, the President will invoke the TaftHartley law ty send the steel workers back/ to their. jobs for an eighty fay period.
