Dr. Norman Shumway of the ^{Stanford} University ~~of So Stanford~~ - heading a fifteen man cardiac transfer team; Removing the heart of an as-yet-unidentified forty-three year old man - who died last night of a brain tumor; Placing it in the chest of Joseph Rizor - forty - father of four - of Salinas, California; a man who had suffered three serious heart attacks - in the ~~ps~~ past seven years.

Hospital authorities later reporting the patient - in "fair" condition. ~~But~~ ^{Now} - the waiting begins; to see if Joseph Rizor ~~can become~~ ^{will be} the second man - ever to survive such an operation.

SENATE

Elsewhere on Capitol Hill - a new investigation was ordered today by the Senate Armed Services Committee. To study the problem of U S military deserters - who take refuge in neutral countries.

Chairman Richard Russell saying the Committee hopes to determine means - of returning such deserters to U.S. jurisdiction. Or if they return of their own accord -- seeing ~~it~~ to it they receive appropriate discipline. Russell asserting that "persons who denounce their country and their citizenship" - should "not be later rewarded or treated as heroes."
