Now that the campaign is getting under way the voters will hear plenty of charge and counter-charge.

UNITED NATIONS

That Soviet proposal in the United Nations - is being taken as another propaganda move. The Russians, suggesting that the heads of government be invited to the General Assembly - to discuss world problems. Date - September Twentieth.

The heads of government. That means -a summit conference at the U.N. September Twentieth. That means - President Eisenhower would be there. The suggestion - obviously unacceptable to Mr. Eisenhower. So around the U.N. they are tabbing the Soviet proposal - as propaganda.

The East German Reds are going back fifteen years

- to find a pretext to start a Berlin crisis. Going back
to the Potsdam agreement of Nineteen Forty-Five. The Potsdam

agreement—signed by Truman, Attlee, and Stalin. Later

ratified - by the French.

The basic document - laying down the conditions for the four powers to control Berlin. Today, the East Germans alleged - that the allies have violated the Potsdam agreement. Giving Khrushchev's puppets a motive - to move on West Berlin.

The allies pr retorting - that we have strictly adhered to the agreement. Which, in any case - is backed by several others, signed by Russia. The West, adding our rights are also based on military conquest. Nazi Germany's unconditional surrender - still valid. Our legal and political status in West Berlin - still sound. And will be defended.

The situation in the Congo - seems to be getting worse. The key to this - Katanga Province, richest part of the Congo - that wants to be entirely on its own - now share its vast wealth. Leopoldville is urging Dag Hammarskjold to declare Katanga - a permanent part of the Congo Republic. The Secretary General of the U N answering - he doesn't want to do anything that might cause a war. Hammarskjold staying on - to try to work out a compromise. Quite a dilema for him.

Meanwhile fighting continues in the Congo. Native tribes back at their age-old feuds. The Balubas against the Luluas - deep in the equatorial forest.

South Korea on the verge of civil war. Mobs, rampaging through the streets of the cities - fighting, looting, burning ballot boxes. The government, calling out the Army, and threatening to put the entire nation - under martial law.

Mediterranean fleet - gives a position of greater strength throughout Europe. Our Sixth Fleet having more fire power, with three carriers, we will have three floating bases- counteracting any possible move against our land bases. The the carriers will bridge the gap - until our Polaris submarines can be deployed. That's why the super-carrier, the "Saratoga" - is on her way to the Mediterranean.

POLARIS

Another Polaris missile launched from a submerged submarine today. This one deliberately destroyed. The missile fired from the "George Washington - seemed okay as it broke above the surface. Its first stage taking over - sending it arching into the sky. But it began to veer - off course. Whereupon the safety officer - pushed the "destruct" button.
