In the midst of national turmoil - the spotlight again turns tonight to the White House; where President Nixon will hold a broadcast press conference - at ten o'clock Washington time. The President facing his greatest crisis since taking office sixteen months ago.

Even in advance of his public appearance though - the President taking a series of steps today clearly intended to calm anti-war dissent. These including the appointments of G Alexander Heard the Chancellor of Vanderbilt University as a special adviser on students and campus unrest. The President also ordered top on administration officials - to make themselves available to meet with young anti-war protestors; those who are currently clogging the capital - getting ready for tomorrow's big anti-war rally. Finally, the President issuing a statement recognizing, as he put it - "the projound of concerns that are rending many of our campuses." He added -

J. Edgar noting that protest demonstrations

last November in the U.S. were accompanied by

simultaneous "anti-US demonstrations" in other

countries throughout the world. This "was neither

by accident nor coincidence," said he; but rather a

"massive propaganda" effort on a global scale zeineck

at forcing "a unilateral withdrawal of US troops from

Vietnam."

The F B I director adding that members of the socalled "new left" who spear head the peace movement - have "clearly established themselves as Marxist Leninist revolutionaries", people who are "dedicated to the violent

of free government" - said he Rading, what's more that they are being used by old line Communist groups - "as a base for continuing attacks against US foreign policy." J Edgar Hoover also blasted the Black Panther Party which he called "a black extremist organization - consisting for the most part of hoodlum type revolutionaries".

Summing up - the F B I director saying:

"An increasingly alarmed populace - fearful of the safety of their streets, neighborhoods and homes - rightly asks when will as much concern be affored their rights - as is manifely Maudlinly lavished upon the repeating criminal offender" - the man "who has openly declared war on society."

Meanwhile, the Vietnam war news was marked today - by another U S air lift into the "parrot's beak" section of Cambodia; with a fresh battalion of eight hundred men - joining thousands more we who earlier seized the biggest Communist arms cache yet found.

As for overall results - the ten day Cambodian campaign is now said to have claimed the lives - of at least four thousand enemy troops. The Allies have also taken - nearly nine hundred prisoners. While at the same time, capturing enemy ammunition - enough to stage an estimated seven hundred hit and run raids; also, enough rice - to feed four thousand men for nearly a year.
