**First, a welcome to station W J N O West Palm Beach, Florida - now a member of the CBS Radio network; also a salute to CBS radio station W T S L - Hanover, New Hampshire - today celebrating its twenty-fifth anniversary on the air.**

BANGKOK

A week long diplomatic crisis between the U S and Thailand - was apparently resolved today to the satisfaction of both governments. The U S sending to Bangkok - a note of regret - over the use of Thai based marines in the ~~Mayaguez~~ Mayaguez incident; <sup>this and</sup> ~~whereupon~~ a statement from Thai foreign minister Chartchai ~~Choo~~ Choonhavan - saying the U S note was considered "a formal apology." Chartchai <sup>Choonhavan</sup> adding that as ~~far~~ far as Thailand is concerned - "the case is closed."

WHITE HOUSE FOLOW BANGKOK

Here at home ~~again~~ President Ford was  
said to be <sup>concerned</sup> ~~"somewhat puzzled"~~ today - over the  
delay in determining U S casualties in the ~~Mayaguez~~  
Mayaguez rescue mission~~g~~. Spokesman Ron Nessen  
~~telling Nessen~~ <sup>saying</sup> the President wants those figures,  
~~as much as you do - and has indicated such."~~  
~~Nessen~~ Adding that there was not "any intention -  
to hide any bad news."

VIENNA

At Vienna today - a start of another series of talks - between U S Secretary of State Kissinger and Soviet Foreign Minister ~~Erromywhp~~ Gromyko.

Doctor Kissinger said to be pressing for a new treaty - to ~~limit~~ limit offensive nuclear arms. At the outset, telling reporters: "I think we'll make some progress here."

*Senate*

*In the Senate - a vote today to call an immediate halt - to the present embargo on U S military aid to Turkey. This following an impassioned plea - from Senate Majority Leader Mike Mansfield who later called the ~~is~~ action "a first step, but a most important one" toward settling the dispute between Greece and Turkey over Cyprus.*

ROME

Meanwhile, the foreign ministers of Greece and Turkey ~~today~~<sup>were</sup> completing three days of talks in Rome; there agreeing to "iron out" their differences over Cyprus - and ~~xxx~~ Aegean Sea oil rights - by ~~means of "future"~~ "consultation" - rather than force.

JERUSALEM

~~In the Middle East~~ <sup>In</sup> Jerusalem, <sup>the</sup> The U S  
was the target of an <sup>angry</sup> speech ~~today~~ by Israeli  
Foreign Minister Yigal Allon; for allegedly making  
arms deals with Jordan - while still with-holding  
weapons from Israel. Allon saying this ~~is~~ not  
only <sup>is</sup> unfair - but poses a serious threat to the ~~present~~  
~~balance~~ "balance Of forces" in the Middle East.

MOSCO W
