Latest from Greece: A story-book twist -- that may yet write a new ending to King Constantine's abortive revolt.

According to informed sources in Athens - the ruling Greek military junta today deciding to let by gones be by-gones. Reportedly asking Greek Archbishop leronymos - to negotiate the terms by which Constantine might regain his throne.

Reason for the woo switch - nobody saying. However, the Gree military regime - minus the King - apparently fearful of losing western support; support - without which - they would be hard put to stay in business.

VIETNAM

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War in Vietnam marked today by a sudden spillover into **mua** neutral Laos. That country ioday officially accusing North Vietnamese troops for the first time of using Laotian territory as a privileged sanctuary.

A Vientane communique specifically citing three North Vietnamese regiments - badly mauled by American forces last month at Dak To. These now said to be regrouping in southern Laos - apparently in preparation for another major offensive. A major reason - we are told - for the one-day truce limit <u>allied</u> forces have decided to set - for both Christmas and New Years.

VATICAN

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Pope Paul's New Year's message to the world a call today to global prayer for peace on earth. The Pontiff asserting that only in peace can man achieve "the highest and most universal values of life - truth, justice, freedom, love."

He also deplored **uarban** nationalism - arms build-ups racism - revenge.

At the same time - the Pope strongly rebuking those he called cowards - for refusing to fight for justice and liberty. "Peace is not pacifism" said the Papal statement. Adding that great risks "are necessarily involved - in the accomplishment of great duties and generous exploits.; "great risks - which no man may shirk - said the Pope.

CHRIS TMAS

Here at home - a second prayer for peace - from President Johnson, as he lighted the National Christmas tree tonight - on the ellipse ta between the White House and the Washington Monument. Said the President: "What sustains us - as we turn on the lights of this tree - is the belief that the spirit of life will triumph over death. The conviction that peace will come - and permit us to give our lives completely to building - wa instead of destroying." That from the President.

OMAHA FOLLOW BONN

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More on the war from Richard Nixon - out of Omaha - Nebraska; where the footxement former Vice President the said today that the United States <u>should</u> retaliate directly against Red China, in the event onfx Chinese planes attack South Vietnam - pox or even if Chinese airfields are made available to North Vietnamese planes for such attacks.

Said Nixon: "The Red Chinese should be put on notice that if they intervene as they did in Korea we will retaliate - and not on the ground."

Nixon adding that he does not favor mass escalation — but he does of the War at this time, — but refusing to rule out the

possible use of nuclear weapons.

Another war-related item -- comes today from Bonn - Germany - in the wake of the overseas campaign traif -- anam of Michigan's Governor Romney. Forces close to the Republican Presidential hopeful - saying he is trying out a new Vietnam policy on various world leaders; A plan calling for uma neutral invasion of Vietnam -- by mutual East-West agreement.

So far - Romney supposedly discussing this idea -- with British Prime Minister Harold Wilson also German Chancellor Kurt Kiesinger - and French Foreign Minister Couve-de-Murville. Of the three, however, only the latter - de Murville $\frac{1}{\lambda}$ suspected of encouraging the Romney plan. French President DeGaulle - himself having long urged neutralization.

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Meanwhile, on Capitol Hill - the ninetieth Congress was speeding today toward a fast finish.

The Senale - first up; completing final congressional action - on that new Social Security Bill, providing for a record three-point-six billion increase in old age benefits., as of March. To meet the cost - another record increase - in pay roll taxes -- effective January One.

The House - and then the Senate - also adding

final approval to that controversial Foreign Aid Bill.

Now on its way to the White House - the measure poproviding for a Foreign Aid appropriation of two point three billion. I owest figure - in the twenty year history of the program.



Later - a new anti-poverty bill - also sp slipping

under the wire.

Elsewhere on the Congressional front -- a new life for President Johnson's requested tax increase. Chairman Wilbur Mills of the House Ways and Means Committee - calling a meeting of his panel for next month; to take up as its first order of business - a reconsideration of the proposed tax hike. Purpose - said Mills - to assure the integrity of the dollar - at home and abroad. The move following a new attack on the dollar

today - in the Paris gold market. Amid reports that the United States and its economic allies - might be planning to clamp down on gold speculators.

DETROIT

In Detroit - success at last. General Motors **Corporation** and the United Auto workers - agreeing today to a new labor pact. Ending the threat of another major auto strike - for another three years, at least.

Money terms of the contract - about the same as those set earlier at Ford and Chrysler. The agreement providing also - "enormous progress" in non-economic matters, said U A W Chieftain Walter Reuther. Final settlement - following twenty nine hours of non-stop negotiations.

ALGIERS

Revolt in Algeria - the story - from Algiers, where President Houari Boumedienne today seized supreme control of the Algerian Army - sealing off all major cities; later announcing he had crushed the attempted coup - launched by dissident Army officers.

Boumedienne's victory claimed - in a nationwide radio and television broadcast. He further credited the victory - to "the vigilance of the Algerian people -supported by the intransigent determination of the leaders; with an assist - said he - from "destiny". WHITE HOUSE

At the White House - a specially appetitizing bill signing ceremony today. With President Johnson putting the final touch - to a new meat inspection law; one that will force dirty meat packing plants - to "clean up or close down" said he.

Approving on-lookers including - eighty-nine year old famed author Upton Sinclair', The man who first launched the clean meat crusade & sixty years ago, said the President. This through his famed novel - "the Jungle" all about "packing town" - Chicago.

One uninvited quaxesst gues't - the President's little dog Yuki; who almost disrupted the entire affair \neq by jumping into IBJ's lap, Fust as he was signing the C-UP, bill.
