The credit -- to a whopping settlement that will cost the city -- an additional sixty to seventy million dollars a year is called by union chief Mike Quill -- "a very, very substantial package." Mayor Lindsay -- terms it "The triumph of reason and goodwill over intransigence."

VIET NAM

MEANWHILE, AT SAIGON, THE UNITED STATES AND SOUTH VIET NAM BOTH AGREED TODAY-- TO ANOTHER TEMPORARY CEASE FIRE, DURING THE VIETNAMESE LUNAR NEW YEAR CELEBRATION-- STARTING NEXT FRIDAY.

Angry rebuttal comes from Governor Hughes of Iowa. "I disagree with him a thousand per cent." -- said the Hawkeye Governor. Adding that children instead should be taught -- "the great danger in using alcohol."

"We teach young people what can happen if they use Heroin or Marijuana" --said he -- "so why not teach them the effect of liquor." Alcohol -- he then added -- is "the greatest poverty creator in America today."
