Ending a working vacation at the western White House President Nixon headed back East todaywith stops at Dayton Onto and Chicago. At Dayton and he dedicated a new six million dollar air force museum containing exhibits of America's Aerospace technology a reminding his listeners that the Museum is in the home town of the pioneering Wright brothers, -- "outstanding symbols of technological excellent so important to American life and our world leadership."

The work one man South Vietnamese Presidential campaign officially began today - with President Thieu a hour favor to commune succeed himself in the October Third election. At the same time -Vice President Ky was quoted as saying he would "destroy" Thieu if he tries to establish a dictatorship in South Vietnam. Ky is also reported saying that Thieu could be overthrown before the election which might not be held at all because of the current demonstrations and unrest over the one-man candidacy. So says Vice President Ky.

In Washington, Secretary Rogers hinted today - we might favor giving Communist China a seat on the UN Security Council as well as membership in the General Assembly. Rogers adding - the United States is still against any move to remove nationalist China from the UN.

Park officials in Washington hope they've found a way to keep the famed Lincoln Memorial from eventually eroding away into marble dust - - a gradual threat ever since the dedicates on the banks of the Potomac fifty years ago. The marble shrine - so familiar to thousands of sight seers has shrunk more than three tenths of an inch since that time. Ralthough pollution and weather has an sex eroding effect on all marble monuments, the threat to the Lincoln Memorial is even greater because it is directly the flight path to National Airport. Sulphuric nitrogen and carbon gasses from city alsplane exhausts react chemically with the marble speeding up the aix deterioration. To counter this, a preparation known as "savestone" - actually liquid synchetic stone -- is being applied to the Memorial. If this does the trick may not need another coat

of savestone for another hundred years.

Clothes - like language - provide a form of communication that has interwoven itself with history ever since the days of primitive man. Thoughts like these are found in a new book called "Fig-leafing through history," written by a mother daughter team - Christie Harris and Moira Johnston -- the latter of San Francisco. The authors see little book hope for nudity. "It cannot last", says Mrs. Johnston, "because it's the most limited look in the world. It's boring - once you'veseen a few bodies, and human beings simply ponts can't resist decorating themselves. The idea of nudity was interesting only when it was forbidden. For most humans, clothes say - 'this is what I am'."
