

EISENHOWER

L.T. - Olds. Wed. June 15-60,

Tonight, the Japanese government issued a statement as follows: "There will be no change in the schedule of President Eisenhower. The government will crack down on the Leftists." ~~xxx before the nineteenth, xxx the day xxx of the scheduled Eisenhower arrival xxx Tokyo xxx~~

The statement adds that the disturbances are the doing - of "international Communist intrigue."

Word in Tokyo is - that the army may be called out. Other indications - that the police may have to resort to gunfire. Hitherto - they've not been doing any shooting. Battling the raging mobs - with clubs, ~~finally~~ - tear gas bombs.

Last night, the capital city of Tokyo witnessed - the wildest outbreak of all. Lives lost - for the first time, in days of rioting. Two students killed, apparently - and the death list may run higher, ~~Considering~~ - the huge number of those injured. More than six hundred rioters and police ^{injured} _λ seventy-three of them, seriously.

The battle raged outside the Parliament Building, all night - from dusk to dawn. Lighted - by flaming police trucks, set on fire - by the mob. A rainy night - with a downpour now and then. Making the scene a weird fantasy - of blazing trucks and rain. Twelve ~~thousand~~ thousand Left Wing students and others - against five thousand police. The rioters - in one frenzied assault after another, attacking the police - with nail-studded clubs and barrages of stones.

They seized a building attached to parliamentary headquarters - and sacked it. And so ^{on} all night, with screaming epithets - against President Eisenhower and the Japanese-American Security Treaty.

In Manila, meanwhile, the enthusiastic welcome for President Eisenhower continued - with American security officials expressing deep concern, as the disturbing news from Tokyo came in. The whole situation - being re-appraised. But the word is - that the President intends to go on to Tokyo.

CUBA

Another U.S. protest - to Cuba. The third in two weeks - accusing the Castro regime of a "campaign of slander" against the United States.

Today's note - incited by another weird Castro nightmare. That the United States was helping to plot an invasion. No, not of Cuba - an invasion of Nicaragua. To be launched - from Cuba. I don't know why we'd want an invasion of Nicaragua - but that's what Castro says.

Today at Santiago, three Cuban rebels were executed by a firing squad. Charged - with insurrection against the Castro government.

ISRAEL

At the U.N., today, Argentina requested the Security Council - to take action in its dispute with Israel, ~~In~~ the case of Adolf Eichmann, the Nazi war criminal - who was seized in Buenos Aires, ~~Then~~ taken to Israel - to face trial for the mass murder of Jewish victims, under the Hitler regime. Today, the Argentine Ambassador to the U.N. called for a special session of the Security Council - to consider the complaint.

The demand is that Israel shall return Eichmann to Argentina. ^(After which the) ~~Argentine~~ Argentine government will not oppose his extradition - under international law.

Israel - refuses.

SUBMARINE

The Navy states that one life was lost - in the mishap of the atomic submarine, Sargo. At - Pearl Harbor, An oxygen explosion - as liquid oxygen was being pumped aboard. The blast - followed by fire.

They battled the blaze in vain, and then the skipper of the Sargo took drastic action. The fire - in the after-torpedo-room. So he took the sub away from the dock - and, submerged the stern of the craft. With the hatch of the after-torpedo-room - open. Sea water pouring in - to put out the fire.

But later word is - that the fire was not yet extinguished. Still burning - in mattresses. So they submerged the stern again - filling the hatch with water once more. Leaving it that way - plenty long. To be sure - the fire was out.

The nuclear reactors of the atomic submarine - not affected at all.

STRIKE

The strike in the air space industry ^{has} spread to the Lockheed Company. This latest walkout - deterring the production of the Polaris missile.

Meanwhile, efforts are being redoubled - for a settlement of the Convair strike. Which has impeded work - at four Atlas missile bases.

BOXING

The long arm of the underworld - reached again, today, into the Senate Sub-committee - investigating boxing. A witness appearing before the Sub-committee - silenced by gangster threats. *P*Irving Mishel, a convict brought from prison - where he is serving a sentence for grand larceny. Mishel - identified as a former "underworld banker" in the prize-fight game. Connected, they say - with a fixed fight, about which Jake LaMotta testified yesterday; ~~How~~ he faked a knockout - in Madison Square Garden.

The Sub-committee wanted to question Mishel about a charge - that he placed bets, on the fixed fight, [^]For Frankie Carbo - called the "underworld czar" of the fight game. Carbo now serving a term in prison - convicted of illegal practices in boxing.

Mishel took the Fifth Amendment - pleading self incrimination. Explaining - that, in his jail cell, he was threatened last month. The usual underworld menace - to keep him from telling the Senate Sub-committee anything about Frankie Carbo.

Well, the intimidation worked - and, later, a New York detective, Frank Marrone - told the investigators that Carbo owned an interest in nearly every important prize-fighter.

The detective added - that boxing is "controlled", as he put it. He said this means - that, when gamblers bet on fights, they are betting on a sure thing.

LIPSTICKS

A government order signed - banning the sale of
fourteen ~~various~~ kinds of lipstick. Colors - red, yellow and orange.

On the ground that they're - poisonous. Containing chemicals -
that had bad effects on laboratory animals. So announced by
the Commissioner of Food and Drugs, George Larrick.

But the ban will not go into effect immediately -
because the cosmetics industry has a right to make a protest.
The belief being - that they'll file formal objections. Which
will hold up the ban - for twenty days, at least.

Today's decision follows hearings, earlier this year.
When evidence was presented - giving the results of laboratory
tests. The cosmetics industry replying that those accused
varieties of lipstick were not harmful - when used in small
quantities. *P* But, now - the tentative ban, Involving - the
fourteen shades of red, yellow and orange. But, *Diels* there
is nothing said - about green or black.
