## _SOVIETS_

## (San'7renciseo)

Today's reply to Moscow covers ground that
has been repeated in the news -- except for one point.
The American diplomatic note presents one contention that is new.

It rejects flatly the Soviet charge, as we
knew it would .- the charge that the Navy Privateer opened fire on Red fighter planes. Declares that the Privateer was unarmed, and accuses the Soviets of shooting down a defenceless American patrol plane with a crew of ten aboard.

The new contention in the note is that the Privateer was not over Soviet controlled Latvia at ail, as Moscow charges -- but was shot down out over the Baltic Sea. This belief is put in the following words: "Investigation conducted by the United States Government has convinced it that the United States Navy plane in question did not fly over any Soviet occupied

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territory or territorial waters." To which the following conclusion is added: "That Soviet military aircraft fired on an unarmed American plane over open sea, following which the American plane was lost."

So, therefore, our government demands amends,
apology, and reparation .- the payment of indemnity for What is described as the "unprovoked destruction of American lives and property" And -- the punishment of the Red flyers involved.

But a State Department spokesman, declares already that the Moscow government has decorated the Red fighter epinale of pilots who committed what amount to an international Wholesale murder. Be points out, moreover, that the Russians showed no sign of wanting to help in the search for the missing ten American flyers - thereby violating all the decencies of international conduct.

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The spokesman accuses Soviet Russia of what he calls .- "astonishing lack of common international courtesy and unusual disregard for human life." But is it at all unusual for the Reds to dis regard human life? An ugly reflection in an ugly episode of the cold war.

## CHINA

Chinese nationalists insist they won
a great victory over communist invasion forces trying
to seize the Island of Hainan. Reports tell of the smashing of a huge invasion fleet -- although it is admitted that one force of Red soldiers got ashore, establishing a beach-head. The nationalists clang
that this party of reds has been surrounded, is being wiped out. On the Red side, the statement is that the communist beach-head is being expanded.

## TRUMAN

President $T$ truman makes a striking bid to enlist Republican help .- and strengthen the bipartisan, farm policy. Today the President and Secretary of State, Dean Acheson, held a conference with Senator Stiles Bridges of New Hampshire - the ranking Republican, in the absence of Senator Vandeberg of Michigan, Who is ill. After it was over, Senator Bridges declared, that the President and Secretary of State wanted an arrangement whereby Republican leaders would be consulted and informed on important points of United States foreign policy. They want to establish what the Senator called .- Closer relationships with the Republican minority in the Senate." President Truman describes the conference as: "very satisfactory". where there is especial interest in a bitwof sew froeWashington -wanking news What telle-of arrangements to expand the biggest bank in the world -- and make it still bigger. Ne hardly need to be told that it is a California institution, the Bank of America -- founded by the legendary A. P. Giannini. A six billion two hundred and fifty million dollar bank, now increasing its capital by seventy million more
 af- stook- Twenty-two new branch banks being taken on, to give the Giannini chain a total of five hundred $a^{n} /$ forty-seven banks. Which is the latest in the growth of a giant financial institution founded early in the century by wagon driver, who flourished in the transportation of California vegetables, took over a sail Italian bank, and went on to create the large commercial banking system in the world -- now to be still larger.

for five days, ever since last Thursday when the OMAR sent a radio message that she was bertugetrable. Then -- silence. The tug put out from Honolulu, bound for San Francisco in spite of warnings that the boat was unseaworthy, not fit to make the voyage.

It was feared r she had sunk at sea; but now .- they have found the OMAR five-hundred-and-twenty-five miles west of Golden Gate.

COUNTERFEITERS

At Buffalo, New York, secret service men this afternoon arrested two counterfeiters -- and say that this hits right at the center of one of the biggest counterfeiting rings on record. For weeks they have been locking up passers of false currency, who spread around some three hundred thousand few dollars .- in ten and twenty dollar bills. But the arrests did not get to the heart of the matter .didn't reach to the makers of the phony money, Wed Who were so skilled, turning out such perfect ten and twenty dollar bills .- that they had bankers baffled.

Now they have been arrested, the secretservice men locking them up today -- two experts who, during the war cleaned up with counterfeit on rationing stamps. They were mighty slick manufacturing money, but were a bit stupid otherwis. .. when they sold
two hundred thousand dollars in counterfeit
to a couple of detectives posing as crooks.

Here is a sad story about one of those miracles in modern medicine .- it didn't work. Operation -- a failure. This -- in the case of a crook, who submitted to surgery, so that his dishonest impulses might be cured.

He is Thomas Hinkley, bad sheep of good family, who ran fantastic career, of passing bad checks. (He left a string of phoney paper cross Eastern states, cashing orthless checks at such a rate that he was able to charter a yacht for voyage to Bermuda, as a caiman of a splurge of high living. In time, he was arrested -- and, in jail at Miami, read of a new brain operation to destroy criminal tendencies. So he begged for a chance -- to go on the operating table and have the surgeons do a job of disconnecting crooked impulses. Sungem/performed in Florida last October, and today Hinkley was under arrest in Massachuset is.

The latest in the Los Angeles airplanebomb sensation is that the wife of the aviation engineer, John H. Grant, declares she will stick by her husband and that she is not hitter. A cocktail party .to hail the news announced officially in London yesterday, that the royal baby, Bonnie Prince Charlie, is sooth to have a brother or sister.

In London gossips are pointing to a rather unusual trend in the married life of the princess. It is now less than two-years-and-a-half since her wedding, and during that time the young couple have spent more than eight months apart .. nearly a third of the total. The last time Britain had a royal consort was in the days of Victoria and Albert .- and history records that prince Albert seldom left the side of queen Victoria. Then, recently, Grant concocted the revolting scheme of kin killing his wife and two children in an airplane crash.
$H_{e}$ called the airline stewardess in the morning, and told her that he wis on his way for the final arrangements on his divorce - the legal formalities that would enable him tofarry her. Then drove his wife and two small children to the airport, together with a suitcase containing an incendiary time bomb. The car belonged to the airline stewardess. At the airport he watched as his family boarded the plane. fwatched also, as the baggage men men were putting aboard the luggage of the passengers - his eye on that suitcase full of murder)

he claims - he lost heart .. and
couldn't go through with the hideous crine. He
shouted to a baggage an, who was stowing away that suitcase. Yelled batista to take rit wot. there was a bomb in it. The baggage man dropped the suitcase .- which thereupon erupted smoke. Grant dashed out, seized the burning piece of baggage, tried to run away -. Dat was quickly caught.

The police found out quickly that the car in which Grant had driven his family belonged to the, They questioned her and she told the story of her romance - a story which, today she repeated to newsmen, weeping all the while.
