

DEGAULLE

L.T.-Buick, Fisher. Fri. July 1st '66.

President Charles DeGaulle of France - returned in triumph today to Paris; supremely confident that his twelve-day mission to Moscow - was a grand success.

As he left Russia - DeGaulle assuring Kremlin leaders - that "France and the Soviet Union ~~have~~ have every reason to cooperate." "Not in a purely formal way"- said he "but effectively and in a practical and political way." On his arrival home - DeGaulle asserting simply: "I have made an important - a truly remarkable trip."

Apparently untired by his travels - the French leader thereupon called a cabinet meeting for tomorrow morning; to give his followers a first-hand account - of his adventures in Russia. Indeed, DeGaulle is said to be so pleased with the outcome of his Soviet trip - that he will probably visit Communist Poland later this year.

NATO FOLLOW DEGAULLE

Reverse side of the coin - an official American exodus from Paris. President Johnson today recalling the U. S. Ambassadors to France -- and to Nato -- for a week of Washington talks; to discuss possible repercussions -- to French withdrawal from Nato.

French renunciation of the military alliance - along with a demand for removal of American troops from French soil - effective today. Accordingly, some American forces - are already reported leaving the country.

RUSK

Still in Australia - Secretary of State Dean

Rusk today disclosed for the first time - another recent American peace offensive. In a speech at Canberra - Dean Rusk reporting that American officials made a number of peace soundings - during the month of May. Starting with indirect contacts with the North Vietnamese - and ending with a direct approach to the Communists. All - to no avail.

Dean Rusk declaring that American troops will gladly pull out of Viet Nam - "within twenty-four hours" after Hanoi agrees to stop trying to seize South Viet Nam. The only trouble - said he: "They keep hanging up the phone."

VIET NAM

For the third time in as many days - American bombers struck again today at the heart of North Viet Nam. U. S. Navy jets blasting another oil storage area - on the outskirts of Haiphong. While the Air Force hammered away at radar and anti-aircraft installations - within sight of the Red ~~apix~~ capital of Hanoi. American officials later reporting "all bombs on targets."

Elsewhere, denunciations and warnings - from both Red China and Russia. Peking declaring that stepped-up bombing - has brought "U. S. aggressors one step nearer to their grave." The Kremlin pledging that Russia will increase military aid to north Viet Nam - to counter the new attacks. Warning, furthermore, that the Soviet Union has "superiority" over the United States - in missiles, submarines and spy satellites.

In the meantime - South Vietnamese Premier Ky - today went quietly about the business of firming up his government. Firing and arresting two general s- for aiding and abetting Buddhist rebellion.

CAPE

At Cape Kennedy - another major effort today - in the nation's drive to send a man to the moon by Nineteen Sixty-Nine. Space officials launching a moon-monitoring satellite - on a three-day voyage through space. A satellite aimed at achieving a lunar orbit - to report back on the level of radiation that will await future astronauts.

BRITAIN

Fifteen months in office - British Prime Minister

Harold Wilson today finally announced plans to make good on an old campaign promise. ^{and,} To make good - with a vengeance.

On the strength of a landslide Labor victory in the last election - Wilson offering for parliamentary approval ~~and with~~ a bill to renationalize Britain's iron and steel industry.

The bill - as written - certain to prove the most controversial of the labor government's domestic proposals - in that it calls for creation of a national steel corporation - to hold the securities of existing companies, with shareholders to be compensated - on the basis of average stock prices over the last five years

The new formula - in effect - a twenty-five percent reduction in the price that Wilson originally proposed to pay - for the affected companies.

NUDISM

At long last - a major triumph today for nudism; in the so-called "bible belt" - of all places. The Kentucky State Supreme Court at Frankfort today declaring unconstitutional - a whole set of laws regulating ~~dn~~ and restricting nudism in the Blue Grass State.

The court order erasing a thousand dollar a year license fee - previously required of nudist camps. ~~Also~~ wiping out a rule ~~4~~ requiring a twenty foot wall around such camps, and sharply limiting ~~pt~~ police powers - to interfere with nudists. All on the grounds - said the court - that restrictions against nudism were "so unreasonable as to be prohibitive."

The ruling in a specific case ~~>~~ involving a nudist society in Greenup County. Among other things - its members accused of creating a traffic hazard; by holding Sunday church services - in the nude - within sight of a main road.
