The air lift between Stanleyville and Leopoldville has now transported - more than a thousand Americans and Europeans. A steady shuttle of planes - bringing out the former prisoners of the rebels. Most of them with horrifying tales of murder and mayhem - by berserh Congolese soldiery. Many of them close to hysterics - after the ordeal they have been through.

The humanitarian air lift goes on - behind the battle line. Shielded by the Belgian paratroopers- who linked up with a detachment of loyalist troops and white mercenaries. The combined force - pushing the rebels back. Releasing the hostages - who survived.

It was hoped that this operation would also be - a king of military dragnet. A dragnet that would catch rebel leader - Gbenye. But so far, Gbenye and his top lieutenants have managed to elude it.

Tonight, Stanleyville looks like - a page from Dante's inferno. The center of the city is - a mass of

smouldering wrechage. Bodies - everywhere. The sound of the guns - echoing in the distance.

BATTLE FOLLOW CONGO

The strategy in Stanleyville was simply to drive the rebels out -- and save the hostages. But -- the rebels refusing to retreat, have been contesting every foot of ground. Result -- the savage battle now raging.

Place of decision -- the left bank of the Congro River, where the rebels are dug in -- tonight. Their enemies crossing the Congo -- in small boats, or makeshift rafts, anything -- that will float. Landing above and below - the rebel positions -- intending to move in on them -- from two sides.

A spokesman for the State Department - has
this to say. "The Secretary of State gave him - both
barrels." Meaning, the diplomatic retort from Dean Rush to the Soviet Ambassador. Dobrynin arrived at the State

Department - with a Soviet protest. Subject - the paratroop
operation in the Congo. Americans, Belgians, and

Congolese - in a quich strike at Stanleyville. Quick enough
to rescue - most of the white hostages. But the Communist

Led rebels massacres many of the others.

The content of the Soviet we protest - well, you could guess the Moscow version of kee what is happening in the Congo. Phrases like - "capitalist aggression".

And "criminal acts against the Congolese people." Also a demand - that all military action cease, at once.

When Dobrynin stacks stopped talking - that was when Rusk let him have it "with both barrels." Our Secretary of State, pointing out that the paratropers

war were sent into Stanleyville as a "humanitarian" measure.

An effort to save -- the hostages. That the action will end -- when there are no more hostages facing death at the hands of the rebels. And that Moscow was kept informed about the situation -- from the start.

Dean Rush's verdict -- on this Soviet protest:
that "A cheap propaganda mensuver," -- so said
Secretary of State Rush. The note from the Kremlin-rejected.

In Saigon tonight - martial law. Premier

Tran Van Huong, Adering more troops - into the capital

of South Viet Nam. Closing all the high schools - to

prevent any more student sit-ins. And clamping a strict

curfew - on the civil population. All of whom are warned

to be off the streets - by ten P.M. unless they have special

permission - to be out of their homes at night.

The Vietnamese police may now enter anyone's home - without a search warrant. As long as agitators are suspected of hiding - on the premises. Strikes and demonstrations - banned. News - under the blue pencil of the Saigon censor.

All this, after rioting that turned central
Saigon - into a chaos. Rioting, so violent that American
officials have warned about - a possible suspension of
American aid.

Here's a figure -- that may surprise you.

We've had one hundred and twenty-five direct talks

with officials from Red China. Place -- Warsaw.

The American and Red Chinese Ambassadors -- getting

together periodically, as they did -- today. John

Cabot and Wang Kuo-Chuan. discussing -- atomic

weapons, with emphasis on a possible summit con
ference -- of the nuclear powers.

We have no details about -- how the conversation went. But the mere fact the meeting took place -- is worth noting. We hear so often from foreign critics-- that we should sto pretending that Red China doesn't exist; that we should start -- talking to the representatives of Peking.

So, here's the answer: - we've been talking to them since Nineteen fifty-five. Regular sessions -- in Warsaw. The latest being -- number one hundred and twenty-five.

A football stadium becomes a national historic landmark? Stagg Field, the University of Chicago.

The plaque is being placed on Stagg Field's North Stands. Under which -- the first nuclear reaction was achieved. It was here that Enrico Fermi and his colleagues made their historic scientific breakthrough -- that led to the development of the atomic bomb, in ninetten forty-two -- now, twentytwo years later -- Stagg Field - under the North Stands - - becomes a national historic landmark. The stadium at the University of Chicago, named for Alonzo Stagg the grand old man of American football.
