Citizens, with a reverence for history, vowing they'll carry the fight all the way to the Supreme Court. To preserve that historic site from commercial desecration.

But who is threatening to sell that sacred Indian
ground - for real estate? Well, it sure sounds like another
case of - wrong done to the Indian by the white man. Pale
faces - wanting to get hold of land belonging to the redskin.
Back in Eighteen Fifty five, there was a treaty
between the tribe - and the great White Father. According
to which - those two acres were to be a Wyandotte cemetery
forever. The treaty putting it in these words: "As long as the rivers flow, and the grasses grow." And, at the last session of Congress, a bill was passed - giving the Wyandotte Indians full title to the property. So now - what has happened?

A Wyandotte announcement - that the Indians are going to sell the old cemetery - as a real estate development.

In Oklahoma, the chief of the Wyandotte declares -
the six acres are worth one million, five hundred thousand
dollars. Which would be distributed - among the nine hundred
members of the tribe. Chief Zane calling a tribal meeting to make plans for selling the land.

So that's what arouses the righteous indignation of pale faces - who love their history. Particularly - Miss

Helena Conley, who is - one-sixteenth Wyandotte. For years foremost in demanding that the historic site be preserved.

Now she says: "If Chief Zane continues his attempts to sell the land - I"m going to put a curse on him." Well, a tribal curse is a serious matter. But then there's the question of one million, five-hundred-thousand bucks Which the Wyandotte Buckles say is wampum they need.
