The Suez Canal conference began today, and all we know is - the externals. The proceedings are xerx secret, and no communiques are being issued - at the dx end of sessions.

Hence, we only know the outer appearance - as witnesses by the reporters, on the outside.

The five man committee consists of Australian

Prime Minister Menzies, Chairman; U.S. Deputy and Under
Secretary of State Loy Henderson; - and representatives of

Sweden and Iran and Ethiopia. Which group, this morning, called

on Egyptian President Nasser, at the Presidential palace in

Cairo. Chairman Menzies handing him - the American plan,

to have the Suez Canal operated by an international commission.

In the afternoon - a second session with Nasser,

discussing the plan. Which - certainly seems unlikely to

be accepted. Nasser having repeated again, last night - that

he will not agree to any *** scheme of internationalization.

But - is willing to accept, what he called, "any solution which

will not affect our sovereignty."

Meanwhile, the Egyptians have arrested another

Briton, charging him with - "espionage." John Thornton

Stanley, Secretary Of the Cairo branch of the Prudiential

Assurance company. Taken into custody at his Cairo home
before dr dawn. The fourth Briton, seized for alleged spy work.

Another test of atomic explosion - in Soviet Russia.

So announced by the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission in

Washington. The third - in a series. The first - announced

by President Eisenhower last weekend. A second, reported on

Friday. Now,)

This latest explosion - equal to the blast of a million tons of T N T. One megaton, as the scientists call it. A-bomb or H-bomb? Well, they say it could be either one or the other. A large atomic bomb, or a small hydrogen bomb.

After President Eisenhower announced the first of the series, Moscow came out in to the open and confirmed the fact.

A series of atomic tests, while the Soviets keep on insisting - that sort of thing should be abolished.

It looks as if the London authorities, headed by Scotland Yard, have been over-doing - the case of Nina, the Russian woman discus thrower.

EISENHOWER

President Eisenhower's Labor Day report - stresses
the economic marm upsurge in this country - the boom.

Following - figures released by Secretary of Labor Mitchell.

Showing that the number of Americans now holding jobs - is
a record-breaker. The number of job holders right now sixty-six-million, eight-hundred-thousand. The previous peak
was in mid-June, when the figure was employment was - sixtysix-million, five hundred thousand.

The President bearing down on the second term item of the Republican campaign slogan. Peace, prosperity and progress.

Adlai Stevenson accuses the Eisenhower administration of, what he calls - "blindness to poverty and insecurity."

The condition - of one American km family out of five.

"They see business," he declared, "as an end in itself. Progress - as something measured with a slide rule, and prosperity as a statistic."

These blasts were fired at a huge Labor Day meeting in Detroit - Cadillac Square. Stevenson's first major campaign speech - since his nomination in Chicago.

He admitted that America is prosperous "in part."

But said the workers and farmers should have the credit for the present prosperity - not the politicians; and Adlai got off one of his whimsies, remarking: "When I hear Republicans boasting about 'their prosperity, I think of the fly sitting on the ox's ear, and saying, 'what a good job of plowing we have done, today'."

He also got off a verbal twister, on the subject of international afm affairs. Denouncing, what he called:

The "blustering Brinkmanship of John Foster Dulles." Adlai
REM coining a new word, "Brinkmanship". Which might seem to

refer - to the Brink robbery. But it harks back to the

remark made by the Secretary of State - saying -- this country

has been on the brink of war. Hence the midd misdaed realbad.

"Brinkmanship."

forever. The treaty putting it in these words: "As long
as the rivers flow, and the grasses grow." And, at the last
session of Congress, a bill was passed - giving the Wyandotte
Indians full title to the property. So now - what has happened?

A Wyandotte announcement - that the Indians are going to sell the old cemetery - as a real estate development.

In Oklahoma, the chief of the Wyandottes declares the six acres are worth one million, five hundred thousand
dollars. Which would be distributed - among the nine hundred
members of the tribe. Chief Zane calling to a tribal meeting to make plans for selling the land.

So that's what arouses the righteous indignation of pale faces - who love their history. Particularly - Miss Helena Conley, who is - one-sixteenth Wyandotte. For years - foremost in demanding that the historic site be preserved.

Now she says: "If Chief Zane continues his attempts to sell the land - I'm going to put a curse on him." Well, a tribal curse is a serious matter. But then there's the question of one-million, five-hundred-thousand bucks— which the Wyandotte Bucks say is wampum they need.
