Afterwards, the President and Secretary of
State Marshall held a half hour conference at the
White House. After which they walked across the street
to Blair House. There a luncheon awaited them - a
luncheon attended by the entire Cabinet. This to
give Marshall an opportunity to brief his colleagues
on the foreign situation, the Berlin blockade, also
China, and Korea. A White House Secretary described
it as a "useful and informative meeting."

The word in Washington is that Mr. Truman's private session with his secretary of State is likely

repeated the charge that a year ago Secretary of State
Marshall suggested that the Nationalists form a coalition
with the Communists and added that if the Generalissimo had
agreed to go along with General Marshall on that China would
now be, what he called, another Czechoslovakia - overrun
by the Reds.

U N FOLLOW PALESTINE OIL

And in Paris today, Russia and Poland charged
Palestine
that Count Bernadotte's/partition plan was designed for
one end. To give the United States and Great Britain
military domination over Palestine and control of all
Middle East oil.

Before the U N political committee the Russians demanded that all Argo armies my should be withdrawn from the Holy Land. The Russian spokesman harped continuously on the words "oil" and "monopolies."

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PALESTINE OIL

There is one bit of news today that sheds a flood of illumination on the motives and policies in the problem of Palestine. A dispatch from Beersheba states that they have struck oil in the Falestine Southern Desert, the negeb. First where fighting broke out, in violation of the armistice. The negeb is, in fact, the number one bone of contention right now -- Israel insisting on the possession of almost uninfact.

Many have wondered - why is the Jewish State

so concerned about the Negeb, one of the most

forbidding paces of land on earth. I've been there,

struck oil in three places. Two of these are under Jewish Control, one near Gaza, where they drove down twenty-two hundred feet, and up came - petroleum.

The same story at a point southeast of Beersheba. The third spot is in a section of no man's land, near the southern tip of the Dead Sea -- the prospectors working there, too. The lowest sport on the planet, 1500 feet below sea level.

The story is that the hunt for oil in the Negeb began several years ago, when Palestine was run by the British. The work was interrupted last spring when the British withdrew and the independent State of Israel was declared. Arab armies pushed into Palestine and the Egyptians seized most of the Negeb. When the United Nations imposed the present truce, the Egyptians remained in possession of what they had acquired.

All of which was followed by the recent flareup in the Southern Desert, the forces of Israel. As they advanced, they were followed by prospectors and derricks -- resuming the interrupted hunt for oil.

Oil in the Negeb would change a lot of

pictures. It would make the barren land a major prize and would have an interesting relation to the whole fabulous empire of Arabian oil.

The world position of the Arabs is founded largely on the fact that they have in their territories the worlds greatest deposits of Petroleum. Geology holds that the basin of the Persian Gulf, and lands in that general area, lie above one vast reserve of Petroleum. the caturday Evening Post gives stunning figures, saying that oil fields already blocked out area represent thrity billion barrels. is that the total may pun as high as one hundred to one hundred and fifty billions of barrels of oil.

desort sayas of arabia. Strange stories are told of local Bedouin Sheiks suddenly become oil millinoaires, their few square miles of miserable desert wilderness turning, overnight, into rich realms of oil.

I have heard much about this from a friend of the transfer a fabrican al exestence this program, max Thornburg, who owns an island in

the Persian Gulf. It was given to him by the Sheik of Bahrein, legended Island of the Pearl Fishers. For centuries the Sheik of Bahrein ruled a realm that owed its existence to swarthy divers plunging to the bottom of the sea and gathering pearl oysters. But now the kingdom of the pearl fishers is an oil field, and the Sheik of Bahrein is an oil multi-multi millionaire. From pearls to petroleum.

It is odd to note how often oil is struck in the desert -- or in country that is near desert. The Bedouin of the eternal sands have oceans of petroleum -- and they need none at all. But it does again give them world influence. Yes, it is curious to think of oil and the desert, especially that forbidding desert south of Palestine -- The Negeb. That gives to the oddity a huge significance in the world drama of the nations.

From Moscow we hear that Andrei Gromyko, who represented the Soviet so efficiently in the matter of vetoes at the U N is slated for promotion.

When he er returned home from the U.S. early this year Gromyko disappeared - or seemed to. There was no mention of his name in the press. Gromyko the forgotten man; so it seemed -- until November seventh, the anniversary of the Nineteen Seventeen Revolution. Then he turned up - in the diplomatic corps stand, in Red Square - Moscow -- all decked out in the elaborate Ambassadorial uniform the Russians recently created. Chest covered with medals. And the very next day he was awarded the highest civilian order in the U.S.S. R - the Red Banner of Labor. What post has he been given? He is in the Foreign Office, a Deputy-Winister - one of the right hand men to Molotov. The report from Moscow is that Gromyko, at thirtynine is the most decorated of the younger Red diplomats.

Quite a success story, that. The story of a

young man who started out as a Government research economist. He showed early brilliance, and rose rapidly, to represent his country at the United Nations. Twice decorated with the Order of Lenin, a member of the Supreme Soviet -- the Russian Parliament - and now, not so many rungs from the top of the Red ladder.
