## CAPITOL HILL FOLLOW WHITE HOUSE

The President also sent key aides to Capitol Hill-- to meet in closed session with a Senate Foreign Relations subcommittee. Senator Biden of Delaware telling newsmen: "The State Department and the CIA have been urging us-- not to cut off Angola." The panel later voting, however-- to suspend all U.S. military aid to Angola; at the same time, urging the withdrawal of all foreign troops--from that embattled nation.

The world's first regular supersonic airline service *will* begin Christmas Day in the Soviet Union.
