**TEL AVIV**

***If lasting peace in the Middle East is not at hand, apparently it is much nearer. Egypt and Israel are reported to have agreed tentatively, on a three year non-aggression pact. This - according to Israeli parliamentary leader Yitzhak Rabin who called the new pact the key ingredient in an upcoming interim peace agreement.***

***Rabin also saying the pact will include U.S. commitments - to both Egypt and Israel. He stressed that the U.S. role - will be "positive for Israel." He himself favors this agreement - "because" said he - "it is good for the Jews."***

## **MINNEAPOLIS PEKIN**

**The President today continued - his mid-west tour first with an American Legion convention - in Minneapolis where he issued a double warning to the Soviets; first, to steer clear of Portugal - if they value detente; and second, to agree to a new arms limitation agreement - or face a massive U.S. arms build-up. The President also warning that attacks on U.S. intelligence activities must not be permitted to lead to another Pearl Harbor.**

## KREMLIN

~~Last week, you may recall - Secretary of State Kissinger warned Russia to keep hands off - in Portugal; a warning echoed today as you know by President Ford.~~ Now the Kremlin view - in an article ~~appearing~~ today in ~~the Communist Party newspaper~~ Pravda.

The Kremlin urging a ~~didanda~~ display of massive solidarity, with the Portuguese Communists. Adding, however, the Soviet people "firmly defend the principles of non-interference - in the domestic affairs of other countries;" therefore, urging "that the complicated problems of the Portuguese people - be resolved ~~them~~ by the Portuguese people themselves."
