Adding that he himself never advocated atomic bombing of North Korea, let alone Red China or Russia. He thought it wouldn't be necessary. He says the records will prove this. He infers, as others who fought in the Pacific have said, that we never needed to use the atom bomb against Japan in the first place.

He repeats that in Korea he wak wanted to attack

the bridges across the Yalu River, with conventional weapons.

And he wanted permission to hit the bases set up by the Chinese Res to support their invasion of Korea. General MacArthur still believes that if he had not been handled the way he was by President Truman he could have won the Korean War.
