## WHITE HOUSE

For President Nixon - a tentative first step today into the field of collective bargaining. The President set up a special labor-management commission to deal with "strife and tensions" in the turbulent construction industry. He appointed as its chairman - Labor Secretary George Schultz;
with a warning that "the national interest" requires an immediate improvement - "in this vital sector."

The President went on to stress that his new
commission - will not bar the right to strike nor prevent
possible lockouts. Nor will it constitute a medium of
compulsory arbitration - said he. Adding that, indeed, its
purpose is to head off voluntarily - "widespread public demand" for just such controls.
atlantic city follow white house

Coincidentally, the AFL-CIO's giant Building and Construction Trades Department - opened its regular convention today at Atlantic City. President C.J. Haggerty the keynote speaker; asserting that "black coalitions" are unjustly "harassing the building trades in several cities" especially Pittsburgh and Chicago. And/charges that said unions are "lily-white" - or guilty of practicing only "tokenism" - are a distortion of fact

A few minutes later - the labor group rejected a black-urged quota system for minority hiring, calling it a "simplistic idea." The added that the building trades will not be cast "in the role of scapegoat or whipping boy - for all the current ills on the racial scene."

A new surge of fighting today in the battle-worn Que Son Valley in Vietnam. For the second time in a monthCommunist forces threatened the village of Hep Duce. This you may recall - is a so-called "model city" in the Allied pacification program; housing at the present time - about four thousand war refuges.

Another development: The U.S. Marines have finally
achieved a kind of parity - with the Army, Navy and Air Force

This by virtue of an order today cutting from thirteen to twelve months - same as all the rest - the regular tour of Marine duty in Vietnam.

This - along with a Pentagon announcement that another seventy-seven-thousand-five-hundred-men are being cut
from the armed forces, along with two hundred planes and twenty two ships. The economies will save something over three-hundred-and-fifty-million dollars in the defense Department budget this fiscal year.

from India, from Persia, and from Africa. And then something happened. We don't know what. For maybe a thousand years the island was practically cut off from the rest of the world. And in effect, time marched backward on Socotra - to the point where the Socotra Bedouin even
today - live in caves and make fire by rubbing sticks
together and they haven't yet discovered the wheel.
Be that as it may - the legend of Socotra lives on and
on. In part, because of the writings of early visitors such
as Alexander the Great, and St. Francis Xavier and even

Marco Polo - Marco Polo found the island literally enchanting.

Marco Polo, told of the sirens of Socotra who made the
winds blow and blow - turning back and often sinking any ship
that dared pass them by.
Socotra's "sorcery" - we now know - the product
of two monsoon seasons annually - lasting fully ten months
of eachyear - which certainly didn'thelpany.

The U.S. cost of living index - same old story - it
was up again lastamonth. Jumping another four-tenths of a
point - for a total gain of four per cent since the first of the year. The highest rate of increase -since the postwar boom of Nineteen-Forty-Eight.
