COACHES OF THE INTERCOLLEGIATE ROWING ASSOCIATION CREWS



GLENDON, OF COLUMBIA

Richard J. Glendon, before being made senior coach of crew at Columbia, served in the same capacity at the Naval Academy under his father "Dick" Glendon, the originator of the famous "Glendon stroke." "Rich" went to the Naval Academy from Massachusetts, where he captained teams in baseball, football, basketball, track and swimming in Boston and Chatham schools. An extensive training in coaching under his father added greatly to his ability as a sculler and a coach. Columbia feels fortunate in its coaching staff, with "Rich" and "Dick" Glendon, in whom it is placing its hopes for a revival of prestige on the water.



LUEDER, OF CORNELL

Dr. Charles A. Lueder, '03, is serving his second year as Head Coach of the Cornell Navy. "Pop" Lueder, as he was called in undergraduate days, was one of the few three-letter men Cornell has produced. He played end for three years on the football team, starred in track and rowed on the famous crew of '01 that holds the world's record for the four-mile Poughkeepsie course. In 1906 he was assistant coach under Courtney. Recently Lueder has been connected with the University of West Virginia, where, in addition to teaching, he was coach of football.



SPUHN, OF PENNSYLVANIA

Fred Spuhn is probably one of the youngest coaches of a major university crew in the country. In 1924 he graduated from the University of Washington where he had had four years of rowing experience. Since that time, he has used his talents as a rowing coach. Last year he coached the 150-pound crew at Harvard, and this year he has done exceptionally well with the University of Pennsylvania varsity eight.



TEN EYCK, OF SYRACUSE

James A. Ten Eyck has become a permanent part of the rowing tradition at Syracuse. As coach of the sport since 1903, except for one year during the World War, he has made the sport popular and successful there. With the death of Coach Courtney of Cornell and the retirement of such men as Wright and Rice, Ten Eyck is probably the only active collegiate rowing coach of the old school. At 76 he retains all the vigor and keenness of mind that marked his own rowing days of fifty years ago.

COACHES OF THE VISITING CREWS



EBRIGHT, OF CALIFORNIA

Upon the resignation of Coach Ben Wallis in 1921, Carroll Ebright, a former Washington coxswain, became coach of California's crews. For five years, from 1913 to 1917, he had rowed and then coached under Connibear at Washington. After a year in the Air Service during the war, Ebright returned to coaching. At the time of Ebright's appointment, Russ Nagler, another former Washington coxswain, was signed to coach the Freshman crew.

CALLOW, OF WASHINGTON

A Husky oarsman for four years when an undergraduate at the University of Washington, Callow captained the Varsity Eight in 1915. He became crew coach at Washington in 1922, and has developed under his tutelage several oarsmen who are now coaches at other colleges in the far Pacific Northwest.



VAIL, OF WISCONSIN

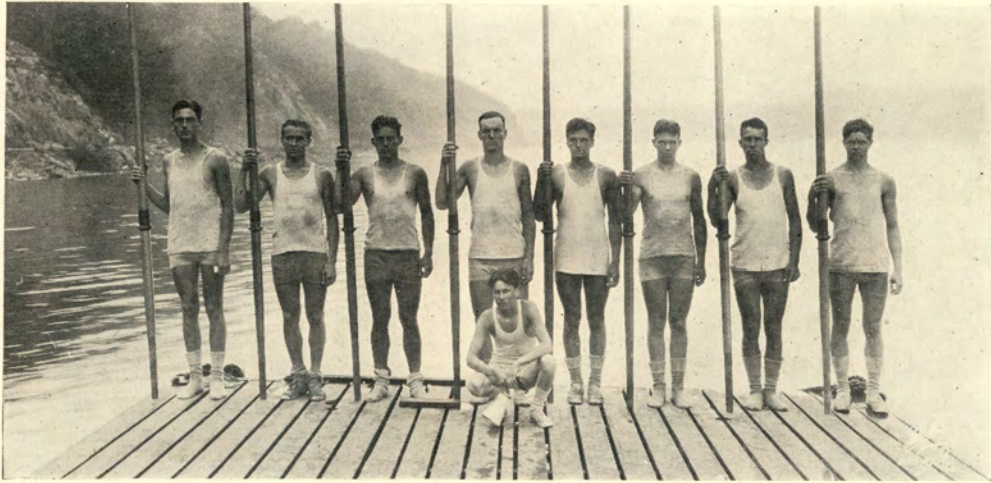
After Wisconsin's great showing on the Hudson the past two years, Coach Harry "Dad" Vail again leads a Varsity eight to the famous regatta. Vail has been in charge of the sport at Wisconsin for the past sixteen years and has again placed the oarsman's game back in its place after what seemed to be a complete wane in enthusiasm for the sport. The loss of six regulars has in no way dampened the ardor of "the grand old man," and his 1926 boat is expected by all Midwest rowing enthusiasts to give a good account itself on the Hudson.



BUTLER, OF THE NAVAL ACADEMY

Robert S. Butler came to the Naval Academy as head coach last fall, in time to give the squad several weeks of fall practice. He was Freshman coach at the University of Washington prior to his appointment as coach of the Navy Crews. As an oarsman at Washington for four years, he learned the fundamentals of the game, which, when combined with good common sense, have enabled him to turn out as good a crew as Navy has ever put on the water.

HOW TO IDENTIFY THE CREWS

The competing crews may be identified by the color of the coxswain's jersey and of the flag on the bow of the shell, as follows:

- Columbia—light blue
- Cornell—light red and white
- Pennsylvania—dark blue and red
- Syracuse—orange
- California—gold
- Washington—white
- Wisconsin—dark red
- Navy—dark blue

ORDER OF FINISH

1. In each race, the *first* crew to pass under the Bridge will be announced by a salvo of bombs, the number of bombs fired corresponding to the number of the *lane* of the leading crew. The *first* crew to cross the finish line in each race will be announced in the same manner. The number of the lane occupied by each crew will be found on Page 5.

2. The order in which the crews finish will also be indicated by flags suspended from the Bridge, the regular college colors of the winning crew being the top flag. Flags will also be hoisted on the mast of the referee's boat, the colors of the winning crew being the uppermost flag,—the rest being hoisted in the order of finish. The colors of the competing crews are:

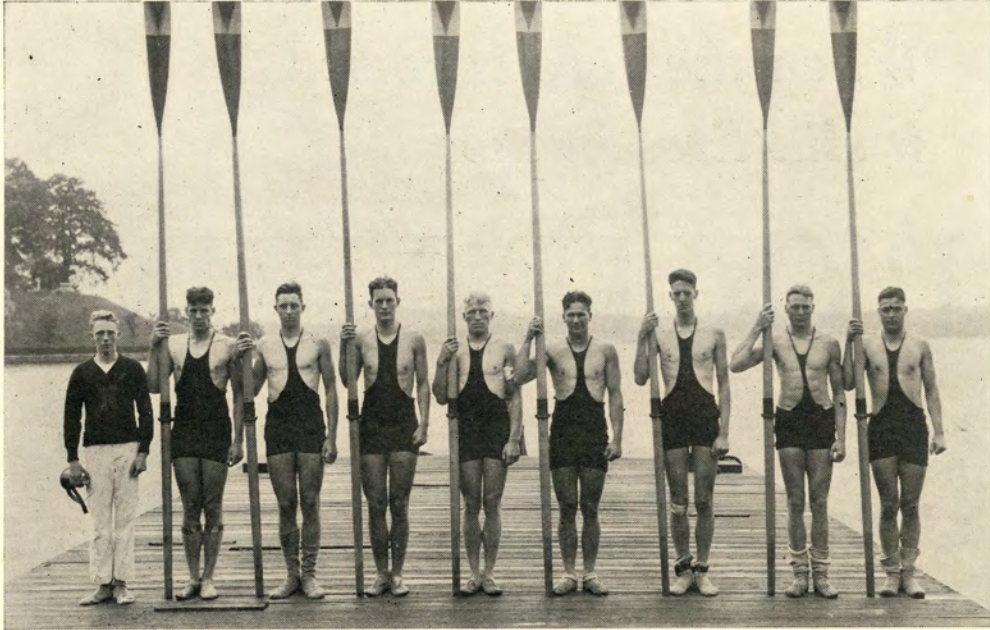
- Columbia—light blue and white
