was the First World Flight, dn which he was one of the
pilots. And I was its historian. General Leigh
Wade's point - the difference in speed and time. In
those single engine planes, thirty-eight years ago
the flight around the world took almost six months.
Astronaut Glenn covering the same distance in eightynine minutes.

(Flying has come a long way - since the meant neandertal period of aviation, since the days when the first flight around the world as was as much of a sensation as John Glenn's rocket ride in orbit.)
