The White House - President Nixon moves boldly in the area of draft reform. The President issuing an executive order today stopping immediately the granting of deferments on the basis of occupation or fatherhood - except in cases of extreme hardship. He also asked Congress for Anabling legislation - to stop the granting of all student deferment; observing that such deferments - "are no longer dictated by the national interest." In The President further seeking an adjustment - in the present lottery de system of inducting nineteen year olds; one that would place the system - on a national rather than a local basis.

The President then went on to pledge a complete end to the draft, - hopefully - in a few years. This - by means of an all-volunteer army. As a first step toward that end - the President additionally asking 2 for a twenty percent pay increase - for all US enlisted

men with less than two years service. And he concluded; "the consideration of national security contains no argument against these historic actions; the consideration of freedom and justice **auromed** orgues eloquently in their behalf." ARMS

The White House again - an announcement today that the US has approved for shipment to Cambodia a quantity of Russian type rifles captured earlier in Vietnam. The delivery consisting of A. K. - Forty-Sevens which are used almost exclusively by Communist ground troops.

White House Press Secretary Ron Ziegler explaining the move - saying: "There are forty thousand Communist troops in Cambodia - and some of them are moving toward Phnom Penh with the latest weapons." And he added: "There is no question - who the aggressor is in this situation."

#### PARIS

On the peace front - Paris - another fruilless exchange of arguments today. Philip Habib for the US - urging the Communist side to study President Nixon's recent report on Vietnam; expressing hope that this will lead at last - to a discussion of basic issues. However, the Communists asserting that the President's latest peace move - is, in reality -Communist reality that is, a threat to expert conquer all of Indo -China.

Indeed, it was later suggested that the enemies chief negotiators - may remove themselves from Paris "within a few days;" thereby leaving the peace talks to subordinates - as they claim the US has already done.

## SAIGON FOLLOW PARIS

Meanwhile, the effects of the US "Vietnamization" program were apparent in weekly casualty figures announced in Saugon. The number of American combat deaths - dropped nearly thirty percent jrom the week before. During the same period - South Vietnamese losses jumping nearly fifty percent; some seven hundred and forty men, in all. The second highest figure this year. As for enemy losses, they are put at three thousand.

#### SINAI

In the Middle East - Egyptian jets struck twice today at Israeli positions in the occupied Sinai. One of the raids - according to Cairo - carrying sixtyfive miles into Israeli patrolled territory. This Egypt's deepest penetration oy air - since the end of the Nineteen Sixty-Seven war. An Israeli spokesman later charging that Egypt's stepped up air offensive indicates "Soviet planning." NEW YORK
