

CAIRO

Fri. May 14-71.

Shake up in Cairo - part two. Egypt's President Anwar Sadat ~~making~~<sup>in</sup> a nationwide broadcast today; ~~saying~~<sup>said</sup> he had foiled - "what amounted" to an attempted coup by political dissidents; and these said he - including General Mohammed Fawzi - his former War Minister; ~~as you know~~, one of six cabinet members - who "resigned" their posts ~~as of~~ yesterday.

Sadat adding that General Fawzi - has since been placed under house arrest. He has also jailed - said he - several members of the Central Committee of the Arab Socialist Union - Egypt's leading political party - as well as two Senior police officials. This - we are told - to permit the holding of free elections - from "top to bottom." Sadat ~~also~~ declaring: "I shall be extremely ~~so~~ cruel to anybody who attempts to rig these elections."

## CAPITOL HILL

Here at home - on Capitol Hill - Secretary of State ~~William~~ Rogers versus Chairman Fulbright of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, -- *At stake - the outcome of a Senate move - aimed at restricting the President's authority to commit troops abroad; leading the two, <sup>who by the way are</sup> ~~men~~ ~~and~~ friends and golfing partners - into their sharpest public exchange today. At one point Fulbright accusing Rogers of using "double talk" in an effort to justify a continuation of the Vietnam War. Rogers responding with a charge - that Fulbright was misrepresenting his views. Adding that any infringement on the President's powers - was unconstitutional -- further, that it would weaken the nation - by tying the President's hands in an emergency. With Fulbright finally saying: "I don't remember when - I've been more disappointed."*

# TBILISI

For Soviet Chieftain Leonid Brezhnev -

a visit today to the city of Tbilisi; where he joined in ceremonies -- marking the fiftieth anniversary of the Georgian Republic; along the way - paying tribute to a number of prominent Georgian ~~men~~ revolutionists; mentioning by name - for the first time since he came to power - one Josef Stalin; ~~who~~ <sup>And for this he got a tremendous</sup> burst of applause.

~~But~~ Brezhnev later saying the dangers of a "personality cult" -- meaning that of Stalin -- had been overcome; also - ~~said he~~ - the dangers of <sup>what he called</sup> "subjectivist mistakes" -- meaning those of Khrushchev -- <sup>as he said a</sup> thus clearing the way for a "moral and political atmosphere -- favorable to good and concerted work."

Perhaps to ~~im~~prove his point - Brezhnev then going on to urge again -- a mutual reduction of opposing forces in Central Europe. This echoing a suggestion he had made a month ago.

## TROOPS FOLLOW TBILISI

Reaction in Washington - first -- from Senate majority leaders Mike Mansfield; who is currently pushing a measure - aimed at forcing a unilateral cut back in U S troops strength in Europe. Mansfield calling the Brezhnev suggestion - a "fine" move. ~~But his own proposal - that "must stand on its own merits," said~~ ~~he.~~

Next - the White House; where it was said that the President, <sup>also</sup> ~~was~~, welcomes the Brezhnev speech. In part, because it clearly shows - we are told - that "now is not the time to unilaterally dismantle our forces ~~in~~ in Europe particularly because of the ~~prospect~~ prospect of negotiations."

In <sup>the</sup> light of ~~the~~ recent Supreme Court

decision on school-bussing -- <sup>now</sup> a reverse twist from

the Department of Health, Education and Welfare;

which today recommended -- for the first time -

a cross-town school bussing system; ~~this~~ as a means

of achieving racial integration -- at Austin, Texas.

HEW Secretary Elliott Richardson adding that the

same procedure will be followed - where necessary -

in "other school systems throughout the south."

WASHINGTON

*Elsewhere in Washington - Transportation*

Secretary ~~Volpe~~ Volpe discusses the American S S T -  
saying it would not cost "anywhere near one billion,"  
as Boeing has claimed, to ~~save~~ resurrect <sup>e</sup>the project.  
Adding that it's too early "at this stage" - for anyone  
to predict accurately the amount of extra costs.

**WHITE HOUSE**

*From the White House - more of the same  
except that Press Secretary Ron Ziegler was also saying  
-- it would cost anywhere from five hundred to six  
hundred million simply to cancel the project. And  
there is no question - said he - no question - at least,  
in the Administration's view - that a prototype S S T  
can be built for less than that.*

## MOSCOW

Moscow - the Soviet Union today announced plans - for the first western unveiling of its own S S T. The Tupolev , one-forty-four -- which has been clocked at more than thirteen hundred miles an hour - to make an appearance two weeks hence at the annual Paris air show.

The Soviets also planning to exhibit:

A duplicate Lunokhod moon-mobile -- a duplicate Lunar Sixteen Moon scooper - and a Soyuz type space ship such as used for all of Russia's recent manned flights.

Akron, Ohio -- a visit from Senate<sup>r</sup> Dole  
of Kansas; who scoffed at suggestions - that Richard  
Nixon might decide to be just a one-term President.
