CAPITOL HILL

On Capitol Hill - the House and Senate

overwhelmingly overrode the President's veto of a new school lunch bill, the third time in eight attempts since the first of the year. Jubilant Democrats say this makes President Ford the most "overridden" Republican chief executive of the century. Meanwhile, the President was in Knoxville with Southern Governors hoping to get support for his new tax program. He was taking the override in stride - but saying he still opposes the school lunch bill; because - it will cost an estimated two point seven billion. Said he: "I see no reason "for children of a family sufficiently well off - to get a free meal."

Back in Washington - Treasury Secretary Simon ^{told} ~~if~~ went before the House Ways and Means Committee today; ~~like the President in Knoxville attempting to sell the Administration's new tax program. Simon saying~~ the President is "absolutely determined" to veto any tax cut bill ~~that is~~ not accompanied by an equal reduction in federal spending. ~~Committee chairman Al Ullman replying, however, the President's position is "totally preposterous" - unless he spells out the specific cuts he has in mind.~~

KISSINGER

Secretary of State Kissinger - at a Senate hearing on the new mideast agreement today said the U.S. is "willing to work with all the parties," including the Palestinians - to achieve a lasting peace. But that the Palestinians must first recognize the existence of Israel - and agree to be bound by U N resolutions concerning the Middle East.

The Senate Foreign Relations Committee later approved the sending of up to two hundred U.S. technicians - to serve as peace observers in the Sinai.
