INDONESIA

Resentment<sup>is</sup> said to be mounting today in  
Indonesia - over Sukarno's decision not to crack down on  
the Communist Party. Not to hold it directly responsible -  
for that abortive leftist coup of last week.

More than twenty mass organizations -  
representing workers, peasants, youth groups, civil  
servants and religious orders -- condemning the Sukarno  
stand, <sup>and</sup> further denouncing the Indonesian Communist party -  
as a "godless, terrorist organization".

RHODESIA

The United States today joined in a European and African effort - to prevent Rhodesia from declaring its immediate independence from the British Empire, ~~and~~ while the White minority of the colony - is still in firm control of the government.

The State Department in Washington, <sup>stating that</sup> ~~is~~ ~~stating~~ Rhodesia will not receive American recognition -- if it attempts to achieve independence on its own terms. The U.S. - like Britain -- demanding Constitutional steps toward majority African rule, <sup>and</sup> ~~the~~ ~~move~~ implying trade restrictions - that could wreck Rhodesia's economy.

~~By the way,~~ If Rhodesia does unilaterally declare its independence of Britain -- it will be the first colony to have done so - since the American Declaration of Independence in Seventeen Sixty-Six.

CONGO

From Leopoldville - news today that government forces - have wiped out a Communist stronghold, Near the town ~~city~~ of Baraka - on Lake Tanganyika.

The rebels - attempting to smash a government bridgehead. When they were decimated in a surprise counter-attack -- by white mercenaries under the command of Colonel Mad Mike Hoare. A hundred and fifteen rebels - said to have been ~~killed~~ killed in the assault.
