## SAN CLEMENTE

Wed. January 5, 1972

At the Western White House - San Clemente -President Nixon today authorized the development - of a new space shuttle system. This, estimated cost - about five and a half billion, to serve as our chief link-up with future orbiting space laboratories. And not so far in the future at that. The President saying it should be operational - within six years.

U.S. space chief Dr. James Fletcher was present for today's announcement when they displayed the model of a proposed space shuttle vehicle - the model consisting of a booster - plus an orbiter. Dr. Fletcher saying the new craft will take off like a rocket, fly like a space ship, and land like an airplane. The President further noting it will thus serve as the world's first reuseable space vehicle; thereby, as he put it, "taking the astronomincal costs - out of astronautics."

And so - hopefully - the start of another leap forward - another milestone in the conquest of space. CAPE KENNEDY

At Cape Kennedy, " in that Apollo Sixteen moon ship, scheduled for take off March seventeenth, space experts today turned up what they called a "technical problem." Which may mean a month's delay. ECONOMY

On the US economic front - the President's pay board voied nine to five today - against granting a twelve present percent wage increase in the Aerospace industry. This the first such rejection in the Board's brief history; driving an immediate challenge from its five labor members - all of whom supported the pay boost.

Indeed, U A W President Leonard Woodcock calling, the Board's action - a naked power attempt by industry members; supported, "unfortunately" = said he - "by public members" - Woodcock adding that today's action - marked "a tragic day for the system of free collective bargaining." INDO CHINA

In the air war in Indo China - an American jet today blasted an enemy missile site in North Vietnam. This The first such attack - since the start of the New Year. Big American B-52s - also Wey hitting an enemy build-up near Khe Sanh. Reverse wey fill an enemy build-up near Khe Sanh. Reverse Laos.

Back on the ground - a series of enemy probing actions; including one apparently aimed at a secret C I A base - at Long Chen in Laos. An American source observing that what with the advent of the dry season - "they re after bigger game now." POLITICS

On the US political trail - a number of Democratic Presidential hopefuls were running hot and heavy today. Chief of these - Senator Muskie of Maine - who formally announced his candidacy only last night. The Senator now setting forth - a new four point one campaign platform - including -- number one - a pledge to end the war in Vietnam.

This drawing a speedy rebuttal from former Senator Eugene McCarthy; who characterized Muskie as <del>comething of</del> a Johnny-come-lately; charging that Muskie had failed to oppose the war - until the Nixon administration was already in office.

Senator Hartke of Indiana - also taking a swipe at his and the colleague from Maine. Claiming that the money for the spent to announce his candidacy and for publicize same - could have been put to much better use; such as repaying the residual debts from the losing Humphrey-Muskie campaign of Sixty-Eight. Meanwhile, Senator Jackson of Washington, Washing up where he left off yesterday. At Pensacola Florida - in so-called "Wallace country" - saying he favors desegregation of schools but opposes massive bussing of students. Jackson diffing that he favors federal funding for the poorer school districts - so that all students can receive a quality education both black and white. ACCRA

Today's stop for First Lady Pat Nixon - the city of Accra, capital of Ghana; where she was met by a cheering crowd, and by Ghana's Premier Kofi Busia. Mrs. Nixon was taken to famous Christiansborg Castle - in preparation for a tour of the land of the Ashanti Tribesmen. This the second stage of her week long tour of three West African nations: Next a visit to Abidjan on the Ivory Coast.

When reporters asking Mrs. Nixon how she felt about her husband running for a second term, she said she thinks he has a good chance of winning, if that's what he wants. Then **manufactures** - a moment's reflection - and she added: "I'd like to see him have another go!"

## BELFAST

The first man to die this year in the continuing violence in Northern Ireland - a young British soldier felled by a sniper's bullet - in the Lower Falls area of Belfast.

Also, another brief clash at Carlingford Loch; where British troops exchanged automatic fire with IRA terrorists - across a lake on the border.North and South.

In a tiny while stone church at Marnes La Coquette - France -- the last rites today for Maurice Chevalier. Those admitted - in addition to relatives including just a few close aides, former co-workers, and long-time friends, among them Princess Grace of Monaco -- the former Grace Kelly. And Then, the casket borne to a nearby hilltop cemetery where he was buried alongside his mother. All just as he had wanted it - simple, quiet, discreet.

It was impossible though - to obliterate completely the famed entertainers seventy-years in show business. Indeed, <u>n</u>early a thousand mourners braving a cold fog - drøv<del>eng all the way</del> from Parisjust to be nearby. Also, two truck loads of floral wreaths - mostly from French show business personalities. But one signed simply -' The Eiffel Tower which was built the same year Maurice Chevalier was born - MARNES LA COQUETTE - 2

Eighteen Eighty-Eight and just like him - a worldwide symbol of "Gay Paree."

Later he painted the official state portraits - of King George the Sixth and Queen Elizabeth.

Perhaps best known - for his many appearances in recent years on British TV. One of his favorite topics right up to the end - women. Sir Gerald once saying: "I have no admiration for the scraggly women of today - I like middle-aged women to have a middle-aged spread." He also on ce summed up his life - saying: "I have consistently eaten too much - drunk too much - broken every law with one eye on the policeman around the corner, and contrary to the best wishes of my friends - I have thriven."
