On this day of personal triumph - Mr. Johnson took time out to pay his respects to an old friend. He flew to Virginia to attend the funeral - of Mrs. Harry Byrd, wife of the veteran senator from the Old Dominion.

Then - back to the White House, and on to

GOLDWATER

As for political debates? The man from the Gopher State says he's willing to take on New York's William Miller, his opposite number.

That idea of political debate is supported by the man who probably will run for the Senate from New York, which is not - surprising. Because Robert Kennedy is following in the footsteps of John Kennedy who made such a point of the debates in Nineteen Sixty. Robert Sevelorementh Keating Kennedy is who challenging an incumbent Rennek one of whose arguments is that an outsider is invading the Empire State. The Kennedy strategy - seems rather evident to many politicians. He hopes to make himself better known in New York - by sharing a platform with the Kroning man who is now senator,

Some New York observers are suggesting that these debates could be enlivened - by making them three cornered. Claire Booth Luce - to be added to the two men. Claire says she still wants to run - on the conservative ticket. And, the lady politician has had some experience - in debating.
