First of all, the mement you first go to your room in a hotel you should know where the exits and the fireproof stairs are.

Not one person in a hundred ever takes thes precaution so far as I have been able to observe.

If fire does break out, put on all the clothes you can got on quickly, so is to cover the body and protect the skin. Dent go rushing out in pajamas.

If a door is hot, don't open it. That means it's already too late. Stuff some towels or anything in the orack under the four and wait for the fairmen to get you out through the window.

If the door is not hot open it Sust a little. Then, if you do not feel any heat, go forthe nearest exist as quickly as you can, but don't go running around aimlessly. If you smell smoke but not much heat crawl on your knees to the exit and held a wet cloth ever your face. As you leave your room, be sure to close the door behind you.

Open doors cause a draft, which fans little fires into big ones.

Above all , dont jump. And don't try to make yourself a lifeline out of the sheets and blankets, except as a last desperate resort.
