MADRID

Thurs. Dec. 17-70.

For Generalissimo Franco of Spain - a rare public appearance today at a rally held in Madrid. This part of an effort to mobilize Spain's "silent majority," so-called - against Basques and other ethnic groups who are now challenging the Franco regime.

At any rate, Franco saluting the crowd - from a will balcony of his Royal Palace, Prince Juan Carlos - the man he has already chosen as his successor - standing at his side. The crowd then roaring, in effect: "Franco, si - Basques, no."

On the peace front - Paris - an American challenge to the Communist side - to stop the fighting "now." David Bruce for the U.S. urging an immediate cease-fire in Indochina - without tying it in to conditions which the U.S. has already rejected.

However, Hanoi's Xuan Thuy thereupol urging that
the U.S. first set its own timetable for unilateral troop
withdrawals. And Bruce tater observing - "no progress."

Half-a-world away - The U.S. Command in Saigon
was issuing a warning today to American GI's; a warning
against the possibility of a Viet Cong terrorist offensive aimed at killing and maiming Americans.

General Michael Greene saying the Viet Cong "always take advantage of any situation that comes their
way." And he added: "If they are not succeeding in the
battle area - this is one way to keep attention on themselves"

The U.S. Command also issuing another casualty report today. Showing twenty-nine killed in action during the past week. This marking the second week in a row-when U.S. combat deaths were less even than non-combat deaths.

Diplomatic reports from Communist Poland - tell

of additional "disturbances" today in the Polish Baltic

seaport of Gdynia; with the sound of gunfire, - again echoing

through the air. They also tell of reported strike actions

in the textile city of Lodz and the coal regions of Silesia.

At the same time though the Polish government has

selecting police reinforcements into a number of potential

trouble spots. Warsaw pledging to mete out "just punishment" - to those it called murderers, arsonists and robbers.

Now this: Polish Premier Josef Cyrankiewicz appearing tonight on national television; reporting that
more than a dozen persons have been killed so far - and
several hundred wounded; blaming the violence - on
"anarchists, hooligans and enemies of socialism." He
also ordered police, henceforth - to shoot to kill.
That's the way they do it behind the broy Euritain.

And still later tonight--a reported bomb blast in the back yard of the Soviet Embassy in Noncom.

At the White House - a call today from Britain's

Edward Heath; his first official visit to the U.S. - as

British Prime Minister; drawing forth a warm welcome
from President Nixon; who said that relations between the

U.S. and Britain are "special" - because of common

language, common law, similar institutions and, above all,

a dedication to general political principles.

Heath, in turn, saying he expected his talks with U.S. officials - to cover a broad range of matters. He also said that Britain's hoped-for entry into the Common Market - "will be to the benefit" of Europe, Great Britain, the United States and the Free World.

At Yucca Flats, Nevada - another underground
