On Capitol Hill - the House today approved and sent along to the White House - a new two billion dollar public works bill; a measure aimed at ~~providing~~ providing some forty-six thousand new jobs - for those who are currently unemployed. <sup>However</sup> ~~But~~ this, - we are told, is a program ~~which is~~ "unacceptable to the President." And ~~so - it would seem -~~ a veto may be in the offing.

The New York Times <sup>today became the</sup> ~~target~~ <sup>target</sup> of a federal

lawsuit filed ~~today~~ in New York. With the government attempting to halt the publication of any additional information - dealing with that top-secret Pentagon study on the war in Vietnam. Government attorneys charging that the Times series - has clearly "prejudiced the defense interests of the United States." Times' attorneys arguing, in turn, that the basic issue here - is the Constitutional guarantee of freedom of the press."

Murray Gurfein, ~~who later~~ issued a temporary injunction - barring *The Times* - at least till Saturday - from carrying on with the series. The Judge also scheduling as of Friday - a hearing on a possible permanent injunction. ~~And~~ ~~The~~ ~~Times~~ ~~announcing~~ shortly thereafter <sup>that</sup> it will comply with the Judge's ~~announcement~~ ruling.

WASHINGTON

More on the same - from Washington; where Secretary of State William Rogers - was calling the publication of secret documents "a very serious matter." Adding that it has already caused some foreign countries - to question whether they can deal safely with the U S on a confidential basis. <sup>R</sup> Rogers also charging that the North Vietnamese are "doing all they can - to play on the emotions of their enemies;" thereby exploiting the prisoner of war issue - in an effort to achieve their political and military goals. Rogers stressing, however, that the U S will not abandon its objectives in Vietnam - as "ransom payment" for American P O W's.

VIETNAM

Meanwhile, a report that some ten thousand North Vietnamese troops have infiltrated northernmost South Vietnam during the past few weeks; perhaps in preparation for <sup>a</sup> major offensive - to embarrass the present Saigon regime in advance of upcoming elections.

At any rate, a force of South Vietnamese marines ~~was~~ dispatched by helicopter today to a ~~point~~ point near Khe Sanh; there to seek out the enemy - and destroy him, if possible. Except the marines themselves - quickly coming under a fierce rocket attack; which lasted four hours, in all - killing at least five and wounding fifteen.

## MIDDLE EAST

In the Middle East - - Jerusalem - a warning from Israeli Defense Minister Moshe Dayan - that a new war ~~was~~ "may be imminent." <sup>This</sup> followed by an order from Cairo - placing Egyptian forces on maximum alert along the Suez Canal.

At the same time, U N secretary General U Thant <sup>was</sup> meeting with Israel's U N Ambassador - ~~Yosef~~ Yosef Tekoah. Later <sup>he</sup> describ~~ed~~<sup>ed</sup> as "inadmissible" - ~~the~~ bazooka attack on an Israeli chartered oil tanker. U Thant also calling on the international community - to condemn such acts; " where they could become said he - "a serious threat to peaceful communications" right around the globe.



HAVANA

From Radio Havana - <sup>the</sup> report today that  
five American "cast-aways" in Cuba - have been  
fined twenty thousand each; for allegedly "violating  
Cuban territorial waters - by landing illegally in  
Cuba.

The same report adding that eight more aboard  
a disabled U S tug - are also facing similar charges.  
All this - ~~is~~ in apparent retaliation for  
fines and sentences levied against four Cuban fishermen -  
for poaching ~~in~~ in American waters near Key West.

**BRANDT**

*West Germany's Chancellor Willy Brandt -  
a visitor today at the White House; where he conferred  
with President Nixon on East West problems -- also,  
the U S balance of payments deficit.*

EAST BERLIN

~~Reverse side~~ <sup>Ed</sup> a meeting of the East-German  
Communist party ~~today~~ <sup>today the</sup> in East Berlin, <sup>Key note</sup>  
speaker party chieftain, Erich Honecker, ~~who~~ urged  
West Germany - to renounce its claim to West Berlin;  
and thereby pave the way said he - for a big four  
agreement that would lessen tensions in that divided  
city.

Honecker ~~said~~ adding that this would be "in the  
interest of strengthening European peace - and, above  
all, in the interest of the people of West Berlin;"  
especially, said he, in as much as "west Berlin never  
belonged to West Germany - and never will."

High above the earth - Russia's Soyuz's eleven cosmonauts today completed their ninth day of extended ~~space~~ space flight; in the process - mapping the lakes, seas, mountains and farm lands of southern Russia; including in part, the route of Marco Polo - along the Golden Road to Samarkand, ~~Samarkand~~ Tashkent, ~~Bobkard~~ Bobkard and so on, ~~and beyond~~

While here on our own shores - the U S Apollo Fifteen astronauts were ~~being~~ running through a series of key tests - including a mock launch ~~and~~ in preparation for their own moon mission - now less than a month away.
