Once more from the New York World's Fair.

This time, from the Hall of free Enterprise. In fact,
here at this pavilion I have just been awarded the Honorary
Degree of Economic Wisdom. If you visit the Hall of Free
Enterprise when you come to the Fair you probably will
be awarded the same degree.

I wonder how many of you understand the simple economic facts of life? Evidently thousands of Americans are interested because this is one of the most successful pavilions in at the Fair -- the Hall of Free Enterprise.

And what more appropriate place for us to salute a former President who is one of the Honorary

Chairman of the organization sponsoring this pavilion -
one of the world's foremost champions of free enterprise -
Herbert Hoover - who is ninety years old today.

HOOVER DAY

All day long letters, cables, phone calls - and proclamations - have been pouring in on Herbert Hoover at his apartment in the Waldorf Towers.

President Johnson, Governor Rockefeller and the governors of most - perhaps all of the fifty states - have proclaimed this Herbert Hoover Day. President Truman delivered his congratulations both by phone and letter.

Former President Eisenhower, King Baudouin of Belgrium,

President Luebke, of West Germany, president Bamon DeValera of Ireland, and endless others - presidents, prime ministers, kings and queens, have sent their greetings, and his countless friends who call him The Chief.

The flag flown over the White House on this

Herbert Hoover Day - and the one in the Capitol will be given

to Mr. Hoover, who has also heard from every Senator and

Congressman in Washington. New York City, has given Mr.

Knover its Gold Medal of Honor and made him its honorary

citizen, the seventh to receive this honor - since the city

was founded with Mayor Wagner, giving Mr. Hoover the Golden Key of New York City. It's a replica of the iron key that opens City Hall, and actually a replica of the original key - made one hundred and fifty years ago. But - this one given to Mr. Hoover is of solid gold.

All over the world today people are wishing a happy birthday to ex-President Herbert Hoover, who in the days when he was involved in his relief work - perhaps in those days he saved more human lives, saved more people from starving, than any man who ever lived.

The Cyprus story tonight - comes from around the world. From Washington, New York, London, Paris, Naples, Athens, Ankara, Moscow. And of course, Cyprus. So - in Washington - President Johnson is warks working around the clock to prevent a war that might wreck Nato. New York - the U N is considering what to do next. London, the Prime Minister is conferring with its Greek and Trukish Ambassadors. Paris - Turkey is pulling some of her forces out of Nato. Naples - an American task force heading for Cyprus.

VIET NAM

Prime Minister Nguyen Khanh of South Viet Nam

told newsmen today that his intelligence sources report

Red Chinese troop movements in North Viet Nam. He wouldn't

say - how large the forces were. But regards the movement

of the troops as - "serious".

The Prime Minister agreed that there has been a lull in Viet Cong attacks since last ma week. When the U.S. Launched its counter attack on those North Vietnamese gunboats. This is taken to mean simply that new orders from Hamoi are being awaited by the Guerrilla leaders.

GOLDWATER

history, for an ex-President of the United States to reach

I'd like to put my salute in a way that may be different from any other you have heard today. Dr. Russell Lee of Palo Alto, Califrnia -- Mr. Hoover made his home there for many years -- and Dr. Russell Lee, the Hoover family doctor - composed a poem that has been carved on a ge great slab of redwood. It hangs in a redwood forest, on the Russian River, seventy five miles north of San Francisco. Here are

There stands erect a giant redwood tree
A living record of tough times gone by
A scroll on which is writ for us to see
Life's triumph over rough adversity.

Here stands a man, serene, triumphant, grand Who like the giant redwood has endured

The pa poem of course refers to Herbert Hoover,

former President of the United States, citizen of the world.
