Good Evening Everybody:

A big surprise in Washington this evening - a major upset in the

Senat - which spent a day in stormy debate on the foreign aid bill - charging that
it failed to promote democracy and friends for the U.S. - as it was intended. And so - the Senate voted - forty-one-to-twenty-seven - to kill foreign aid al ogether.

What next? It's too early to tell - possibly an attempt later in the year to revive the program - perhaps a motion continuing aid temporarily at last year's level.

If there remained any doubt whether communist China would actually claim its hard-won seat at the

United Nations - that doubt was finally dispelled today. Peking's Acting Foreign Minister - Chi Peng-Fei - sent a cable to U.N. Secretary General $U$ Thant; serving notice that "the People's Republic of China - will send a delegation in the near future" to the current session of the General Assembly.

This was the U.N.'s first direct communication from

Communist China - since Nineteen-Fifty; when Peking sent over a representative - to discuss the Korean War.

It might also be noted that the Chinese communication

- was rather terse and straight to the point; ignoring the
usual diplomatic amenities - except for its last sentence.
And there - Chi Peng-Fei told U Thant: "Please accept the assurances - of my highest consideration." For those who make a study of such things - that's an encouraging sign - at least, a start.

WHO FOLLOW UNITED NATIONS

Elsewhere at the U.N. - the case for DDT; as
presented today - by Dr. A.W.A. Brown of the World Health Organization; who agreed that the use of DDT - might endanger certain species; but he called it, nevertheless, the cheapest and most effective weapon against malaria - the world's most widespread killing and debilitating disease.

Dr. Brown added that for humans - "DDT has proved
fantastically safe - just about as safe as you can get." He
further stated: "DDT has never killed anybody - but it has saved fifty million people from dying of malaria in the past twenty-five years."

WHITE HOUSE
