

ALGIERS

Tues, Nov. 27 - 73.

The main speaker today at that Arab summit meeting in Algiers - Egypt's President Sadat; ~~who~~ called for "continued use of the oil weapon" to bring pressure to bear on Israel. Sadat saying: "The battle has not ended - and fighting could be resumed any minute." Adding: "What happened on October six was just the spark; - ~~the~~ <sup>and then he added:-</sup> ~~the~~ conflict will continue for generations."

~~For all his bombast though~~ - Sadat also referring briefly to coming peace talks, <sup>said:-</sup> ~~saying~~ "The military battle alone cannot resolve the situation in the present age - and we are on the right track."

WHITE HOUSE

~~The White House~~ President Nixon met today with House and Senate leaders - of both parties; with the help of Secretary of State Henry Kissinger - reviewing the Middle East situation and the energy crisis. Senator Fulbright of Arkansas - one of those present, later saying that the chief question raised - was how long the Arab oil embargo might last. The President <sup>was</sup> quoted as saying it all ~~same~~ depends on "the progress of negotiations <sup>as</sup> the peace conference" between the Egyptians and Israelis "hopefully get<sup>s</sup> under way."

Sen. Fulbright also noting on his own that the U S has plenty of resources - with which to meet its long range energy needs. But he added - "in the short run - it's very difficult."

## HOUSE

Capitol Hill again - the House today  
approved a bill - aimed at ~~the~~ placing the entire

# UNITED

The nation's largest ~~airline~~ became today the first ~~ma~~ U S airline - to order a major cutback due to the energy <sup>problem</sup> ~~crisis~~. United airlines - cancelling one hundred daily flights as of January seven. Also, announcing plans to furlough more than a thousand employees - among them <sup>some</sup> ~~about~~ three hundred pilots. United's President Edward Carlson <sup>saying</sup> ~~stating~~ - there may be more. "No one really understands yet" - said he - "the impact of the present fuel situation on the ~~airline~~ airline industry, but one thing is certain, he continued; the energy crisis "is going to be with us - for a long time."

# WATERGATE

~~At long last,~~ A portion of one of President Nixon's ~~disputed~~ Watergate tapes was finally heard today in public. The tape in question - ~~dating back~~ to June twentieth, Nineteen Seventy Two; ~~just~~ three days - after the Watergate break-in.-- <sup>Including</sup> ~~reproducing~~ conversation between the President - and two of his ten top advisors, John Ehrlichman and H R Haldeman.

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~~All of this - taking place~~ <sup>It was run off</sup> in the court room of Federal Judge John Sirica <sup>as</sup> an accompaniment to the testimony of Rosemary Woods - the President's personal secretary; who was ~~attempting to~~ explaining how an eighteen minute ~~section~~ <sup>section</sup> of the tape - was somehow <sup>wiped</sup> ~~obliterated~~.

~~In any event,~~ What <sup>remained</sup> ~~was left~~ sounding much like an old short wave radio broadcast; also, filled with

*such*  
~~extraneous~~ noises ~~such~~ as loud bangs, the sound of  
a jet aircraft and occasional whistling; ~~with~~ what was  
left - largely unintelligible. One part that came  
through loud and clear though the President saying,--  
~~along the way:~~ "I'd like a little of that consomme."



## HEARINGS

The Senate Watergate committee formally voted today ~~to~~ to call off any further hearings till January, at least. Vice Chairman Howard Baker saying there was simply insufficient "hard evidence"

to warrant ~~ing~~ <sup>ing</sup> ~~proceed~~ <sup>Sen.</sup> at this time. <sup>^</sup> Baker adding: "The responsible thing to do - is to get your ducks in a row before you start swimming in the pond."

## DRUGS

The President also met today - with his top narcotics officials, -- ~~in the main~~, reviewing the results of an international effort to control drug smuggling.

At the same time, a Presidential statement - saying "we are now on the way to winning the battle against" drug traffic. "The result" <sup>says</sup> the President ~~went on~~ <sup>"</sup> ~~that~~ our heroin addict population has begun to decline - and the rate of new addiction is down sharply." "Now our main concern" - said he - "must be to press on and finish the task."
