Snow along the East Coast. Hardest hit - New Englad. The Midwest blizzard, now sweeping over all the states from Connecticut to Maine. A foot of snow in many parts. Driven by winds - of fifty miles per hour. Piling up huge drifts; blocking highways, closing schools and stores. Forcing Boston to ban parking in the streets. Raising small craft warnings all along the coast.

All this, just after New England had been enjoying - what seemed like a touch of an early spring. That mine disaster at Fukuoka, Japan was caused by an overheated air-compressor. The wires, burning through, starting two fires a quarter of a mile underground, the flames whipping out of control. Blocking the exit. Sending columns of dense, black, poisonous smoke - careening up the shafts, and along the tunnels.

Ninety-one miners - were trapped. Nineteen - dashing to those safety. The lucky ones - who were near enough to the exit to get out. The other seventy-two miners of feared dead.

The key point in today's new conference at the State Department - Berlin. Secretary of State Rusk, reaffirming our position on West Berlin. Stating bluntly, that our rights are not up for negotiation. That we will, in Rusk's words -"Neither compromise, nor surrender." And he wants everyone to understand our attitude. Everyone? That means Khrushchev.
