HOUSE

From a hundred and one House Republicans - a
letter addressed to the President. The House group
telling the President: "Several of our colleagues have publicity and we think, improperly called upon you to resign."

Adding: "We believe substantial numbers of the House members feel as we do - that calls for your resignation ill-serve the nation - and, in fact, damage the prestige of the House itself.

The letter going on to say: "Our collogues would m more properly serve the nation by using their influence to bring impeachment" proceedings to a prompt conclusion; so we can all focus more effectively on other important issues confronting the nation."

At Key Biscayne - an attempt today to explain
the President's decision to close the tap on special

Watergate prosecutor Leon Jaworski. It comes from the President's chief watergate lawyer - James St. Clair; who says additional documents sought by Jaworski are "at best only corroborative of or curative to - evidence already before the Grand Jury; and thus would only delay the Grand Jury deliberations for "many months."

St. Clair adding that "under these circumstances,
the President determined that continued and seemingly
unending incursion into the confidentiality of Presidential communications - was unwarranted."

Meanwhile, in Washington another pret trial hearing
in the case of former White House aide Dwight Chopin -
this including a reprimand from Federal Judge Gerhard Gesell, for a statement Jaworski recently made on TV dealing with the veracity of expected prosecution witness

John Dean,. The Judge instructing Jaworski to refrain, henceforth from making any extra judicial statement. Adding:
"It seems to me - you should have the good sense to stay
off talk shows."

Omaha, Nebraska - the final stop today for Gerald Ford on his three day trek through mid-America. In response to reporters questions - the Vice President denying that his recent travels - have anything to do with running for the Presidency. Stressing as he had before that he has no intention of being a candidate for any office in Nineteen-Seventy-Six.

Earlier, in Chicago - Gerald Ford mixing football with politics was telling how he would like to give the American people a between halves locker room pep talk on what is right rather than wrong with the nation. The Vice President saying: "There would be no excuses. I would simply say that we must not look at the points we have lost but at the points we can gain." And he added emphatically

- "Americans are winners!"
