The latest from Korea tonight pictures the Chinese Communists in a massive, two-pronged offensive aimed at Seoul. The Reds have captured the town of Munsan, twenty miles northwest of the capital, and are striking down the main highway. U.N. forces are falling back, followed closely by masses of the energy.

On the central front, the Red break through was made today by counter attacks. U.S. tanks leading in slashing assaults against the salient thrown into the Allied lines. That brought the Red Spring offensive to a halt in Central Korea -- while in the east an armored column smashed back into the town of Inje, which Red Koreans captured on Monday.

Today's dispatch states: "Reports from the front made it plain that the international Eighth Army had weathered the initial attack of the offensive -- in good order. eight hours ago. The Chinese have a bloody nose, and must be wondering what they ran into."

But, despite the huge enemy losses, it is believed that further withdrawals are likely, before the Chinese are thrown back. The American officer says: "We are prepared to give up a lot more ground, if we have to."

Secretary of State Acheson reveals that Chiang Kai-shek agreed to use American military aid only to defend Formosa against a Communist invasion. The national regime on the island conceded that point six weeks before General MacArthur suggested an attack of the Red mainland by Chiang Kai-shek's army.
