A final chapter today - in the terribte story of mass murderer Charles Whitman, At his home town - of Lake Worth, Florida.

The last act: A mass of requiem for both

Whitman and his mother - one of his first victims. In

the same church - where Whitman once served as an altar

boy. Whereupon mother and son - were buried side-by=

side in a family plot.

Father Thomas Anglim - who read the mass later distributing a statement to reporters, Explaining
why one of the worst murderers in history was given
a Christian burial. Father Anglim deck declaring that
according to Catholic moral theology - "no serious crime
can be imputed to an individual - unless he has committed
it with sufficient knowledge and full consent of the will."

"Apparently these were lacking - in the final tragic actions of this young man" - said the Priest. Adding that, therefore - "God in his mercy - does not hold him responsible."

Today in Viet Nam - the second anniversary

of the start of U S bombing raids - on the Communist

North, Commemorated by still another wave of U S jets

flying north - to do it all over again. As an American

officer put it "just like we do every day."

In their latest venture - the American warplanes completing a total of eighty-three missions. Blasting oil depots, supply centers and anti-aircraft installations - along with miscettaneous targets of opportunity. All the way from border between North and South Viet Nam-to the vital red seaport of Haiphong.

Meanwhile at Moscow - the Kremlin today accused
the United States of hitting a Soviet ship- with so-called
"large caliber bullets" during recent raid - on Haiphong,
"Harbor. Thus allegedly endangering "the life of the
members of the crew - and the security of the ship."

The charge contained in a note - delivered to

the US Embassy. Demanding "immediate discontinuance

of such actions" - wh-ch it called "criminal" and

"provocative."

The note of the Soviet charges, adding, knowed that we could not accept the note - because of its "abusive and offensive language."

RUSK FOLLOW MOSOW

Meanwhile another warning today that

U.S. troops - may yet be forced to enter the demilitarized zone between North and South Viet Nam. Secretary of State Dean Rusk asserting that the US has no "policy desire" to cross the seventeenth parallel. But we must and will take necessary measures - said he "to insure the safety of our forces."

At Jakarta and at Kuala Lumpur - joint announcement today that Indonesia and Malaysia will soon sign a formal peace treaty. Officially ending - their three year old undeclared war.

Despite recent verbal attacks by Sukarno of Prodonesta - the peace treaty essentially that worked out earlier ktheix this summer of at preliminary peace talks - in Bangkok.

The treaty to be signed at Jakarta - welre told - probably on August Seventeen. The date presumably chosen - because it coincides with Indonesia's Independence Day.

Have you heard the latest about Grandma Moses? You will remember the sensation she made when in her eighties and nineties and even when she was a hundred years old -- she was one of the most famous artists of our time. She died at age one hundred and one in upper New York state, at Eagle Bridge. Now the little white schoolhouse that she attended way back in Eighteen Seventy-Four henceforth will be known as the Grandma Moses Schoolhours; a permanent museum, with the furnishings from her home on display and of course some of her paintings too.

The museum opens tomorrow -- August Sixth. I have just had word of this from Harry Squire long next door neighbor of Grandma Moses. Harry Squire, as many will, I hope, remember, was the chief cameraman for Cinerama in the days when we were turning out the Cinerama productions that started a worldwide screen revolution, the wide screen era.

Fred Waller invented Cinerama, and Harry

Squire was the wizard behind the camera. Alas, Cinerama

has fallen into the hands of people who use the name but

not the process. Harry Squire lives in retirement at

Eagle Bridge, just up the road from the Grandma Moses

museum, which propar people from far and wide will

now be visiting.
