For the second day in a row - the sound of gunfire was heard today in Beirut - also, a number of explosions.

Unconfirmed reports further telling of an attempted pre-dawn attack - in the U.S. Embassy; an attack supposedly turned back - by Lebanese security guards. At the same time - fresh fighting between Lebanese Army troops and Arab guerillas - near the border with Israel.

All in all - a return to the near-civil war conditions - that prevailed for much of last week. But even so - Lebanon's Commander-in-Chief - Major General Emile Gustani - flying to Cairo. There to attend talks - aimed at appearing the guerillas; while, perhaps, safeguarding Lebanon - against the threat of Israeli reprisals.

Speaking of which - Israeli jets attacked guerilla bases in Jordan today. And they also blasted Egyptian targets - in the Suez area.

In Vietnam, the Saigon government announced plans to release twenty-four Communist prisoners of war - as of tomorrow. This following by two days a Viet Cong broadcast - pledging to free three captured Americans.

St. Barbe Baker has told me many times about an ocean of water under the Sahara in North Africa and how some day when this is tapped the vast Sahara Desert, will be transformed into a region so productive it will feed half the inhabistants of the earth.

And maybe the same is true of the immense Australian Desert where am at the moment. Outside my window here at Narwietooma cattle station are mulga, supplejack and bloodwood trees from whose branches a flock of many colored parrots keep screaming and scolding me whenever I try to read Alexander Kendrick's superb biography of Ed Murrow that I brought along. And by the way, don't miss it.

As for the future of most of Australia which had been thought a waterless desert, my host Eddie Connellan and his

two sons, expect to turn their million acres or so into lush green fields. They have tapped an inland lake of water at a depth of from one hundred to two hundred feet. So far they have driven thirty four of these so-called bores, deep wells.

Scientists now say that this under-the-desert-sea of water or lake is not affected by the arid climate of Australia. They believe that this water comes from the glaciers and the mountains of the great island of New Guinea, a distance of from twelve hundred to fifteen hundred miles to the North. New Guinea always has all the year round heavy tropical rains.

So you can see that this may mean that the big empty continent of Australia before too long will be inhabited by millions of people. Solong.....
