DULLES

The hope in Washington is - that Secretary Dulles will be able to participate in the talks with British Prime Minister MacMillan, next week. The hope expressed at the White House and the State Department. The President and the Prime Minister - to meet for the sessions on the Berlin crisis. Secretary Dulles to join them.

The President of Ecuador announces - he'll seek a fourth term. Although you might think that three terms would be sufficent -- for any president. However, the first two times, Jose Velasco Ibarra was overthrown - before his presidential term ended.

Shadows of the past - at a court room in the old city of Florence, today. The name of the defendant - Mussolini.

Vittorio Mussolini - son of the Fascist dictator. On trial - for desertion in time of war.

Vittorio Mussolini - a captain in the Italian air force, in the days when his father was the Duce. On leave of absence - when Dictator Mussolini was overthrown, the son r then failed to rejoin his air squadron, listed - as a deserter.

After the war, he was tried, convicted - and sentenced to twenty-seven months in prison. Which he never served - having got away to Argentina. The prison sentence was later dismissed, under an amnesty. But now, Vittorio Mussolini, forty years old, has returned from Argentina to Italy. To clear himself - of the charge of desertion.

Before a military court in Florence, he rem presented evidence - that he was in Germany during his leave of absence.

The Nazis - not permitting him to return.

So, today, the court reversed the previous conviction. Vittorio Mussolini - cleared of the charge of desertion.

London - won't be the same. When they carry out
the new plans - for Piccadilly Circus. That favorite
place - for popular celebrations in London.

It's a circle of old-fashioned buildings, shops and amusement places, with flashing neon signs, and in the middle - a statue of Bros, the reek God of Love.
