Elsewhere in Washington , a stunning blow to the Presidential aspirations of George McGovern. The Democratic Credentials Committee rejecting today the winner take all provision of that California Presidential Primary. Education Thereby stripping McGovern -- of one hundred and fifty one votes; all but killing his chances for a first be ballot victory at the Democratic National Convention. Indeed, annoffices an unofficial tabulation - now showing McGovern nearly three hundred votes short.

MCGOVERN FOLLOW DEMOCRATS

Far from desparing though - the McGovern were forces quickly pledging a full floor fight on the California dispute. McGovern himself calling the Credentials Committee action -- "an incredible, cynical, rotten, political steal -- a corrupt spiteful deal;" one that will be rejected -- said he - by the Miami convention "and the American people."

McGovern further saying of the decision:

"It means that I continue to wage an uphill fight
Lalled
but that's the position I've been in from the beginning."

The Supreme Court's last decision day prior to
recess proved to be a big one, including a series of major
rulings sharply limiting the applications of congressional
immunity - also, freedom of the press.. to the extent that
newsmen must now testify before grand juries. But the biggest
ruling of all - a long-awaited decision banning the death
penalty. The court majoring calling it cruel and unusual
punishment - in violation of the eighth and fourteenth
amendment."

The verdict was close though - five to four; with the four dissenters - all Nixon appointees. Of these - Justice Blackmun perhaps best summarizing the minority view. "I yield to no one" said he, "in the depths of my distaste, a ntipathy, and abhorrence for the death penalty." But, "I find it difficult" - he continued - "to accept or to justify today's decision "as a matter of history, of law or of constitutional pronouncement." Justice Blackmun adding; in short: "I fear the court has over-stepped."

The White House; - an attempt to hold the line on food prices, President Nixon signiting today an executive order - extending price controls to the processing and handling of farm products and sea foods. In effect, applying a profit squeeze to wholesalers, actains retailers and other middle men. The President's strategy later, spelled out by director Donald Rumsfeld of the Cost of Living Council. Rumsfeld observing that tougher controls "cannot drive food prices down - only increased supply or reduced demand can do that." "But they are designed" - said he - "to exert discipline on mark-ups and margins & at each step of the food marketing chain."
